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Budget Speech 23 February, 2022

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I. Honourable Speaker,

With your permission, I am presenting the Revised Estimates of the State for the year 2021-22 and the Budget Estimates for the year 2022-23.

- 2. Budget has been an important medium for fulfilment of common man's dream of a happy and prosperous life, for maintaining the pace of sustainable development, development of infrastructure facilities and welfare of all sections of society.
- 3. Much like always in past, we have tried to put into action a plan for the future keeping in mind the aspirations and suggestions of residents of the state including farmers, cattle farmers (pashu-paalak), businesspersons, students, youth, women professionals, educationists, health specialists, labour organisations, public representatives and civil society.
- 4. I had presented the **First Gender Budget** of the state in the year 2012-13 and also presented the **First Paperless Budget** in the year 2021-22. Today, I feel privileged to present the state's first **'Agriculture Budget'**. This progressive initiative will not open new avenues for agriculture development but also make our farmers more prosperous.
- 5. Like the entire nation, the State has also gone through a difficult phase on account of Corona over the last two years. After the presentation of our last Budget, the second wave of corona wreaked havoc on the whole country. While on the one hand our Corona management was appreciated at national-international level, on the other, we have kept our promises and maintained the pace of development. Today, as I present the financial plan for the coming year before the honourable House, I am glad that despite of limited financial resources, reduced central grant and battling with Corona for two out of three years of our tenure, we have implemented more than 85 per cent of Budget announcements and more than 70 per cent of our manifesto promises. This has been possible only because of our proficient financial management. We will continue to work towards happiness and allround prosperity of the State, dealing with the challenges with the same commitment.

Do not ask where my destination is,

The journey is yet to start. I won't give up till my last breath, It's a promise not made to others but to my own heart.

- 6. Corona posed a big threat to state's economy and the livelihood of our people. During that time, UPA Govt's 'Mahatma Gandhi Narega Yojana' supported residents of rural areas with their livelihood. There is no such scheme for the Street Vendors (sellers of fruits, vegetables and other products on carts, kiosks or tracks), people working in dhaabas, restaurants etc. in rural areas. I believe that we will have to provide greater support to residents affected by Corona, to help bring their lives back on track. Toward this
 - I. I announce the 'Indira Gandhi Shahri Rozgar Gaurantee Yojana' for ensuring the employment in the cities as well. Under this, from the forthcoming year, families residing in the urban areas will be provided with 100 days of employment per year on demand. Aproximately, Rs.800 crore will be spent annually for this.
 - II. To help cope with the circumstances arising due to Corona, I announce increasing 100 days of employment under Mahatma Gandhi Narega Yojana to 125 days from State budget from the forthcoming year. Aproximately, Rs.750 crore will be spent on this.
 - III. To compensate for the loss in education during Corona, it is proposed to start three-month Bridge Courses for School students from forthcoming year. Provision of Rs.75 crore will be made for this.
 - IV. Families of all sections have faced economic impact of Corona. Now, to provide relief to all 118 lakh domestic consumers along with low income group I announce to provide up to 50 units of electricity free-of-charge in the forthcoming year to consumers consuming electricity up to 100 units per month. Along with this, I also announce a subsidy of Rs.3 per unit on consumption up to 150 units and Rs.2 per unit on consumption of 150-300 units for all domestic consumers. In this way, consumers consuming more than 300 units per month will also be able to get relief according to the slabs. This will result in a burden of

aproximately Rs.4,500 crore.

MEDICAL & HEALTH

7. Respected Speaker, Towards fulfilling our commitment of Nirogi Rajasthan, it is a priority of our government to provide easy access to medical and health facilities to every resident of the state. With the implementation of Mukhya Mantri Chiranjeevi Swasthay Bima Yojana along with Mukhya Mantri Nishulk Dawa Yojana (Free medicines) and Mukhya Mantri Nishulk Janch Yojana (Free pathology tests), Rajasthan has become a leading state to provide 'Universal Health'. Approximately 1 crore, 33 lakh families have registered under this scheme, and it is a matter of pleasure for the house that more than 7.41 lakh people have already availed cashless treatment worth Rs.930 crore in a span of just 9 months.

I now announce to enhance the medical insurance amount from Rs.5 lakh per family per annum to Rs.10 lakh under the Chiranjeevi Yojana from the coming year. Widening the scope of this scheme from the coming year, free-of-cost treatment will also be provided for Cochlear Implant, Bonemarrow Transplant, Organ Transplant, Blood/Platelets/ Plasma Transfusions and Limb Prosthesis (Bone Cancer). Additionally, to ensure that no destitute family is deprived of availing the benefits of this scheme, it is proposed to authorise the District Collectors to direct the concerned hospitals to provide free-of-cost treatement to such person without a Chiranjeevi Card, and also to ensure Chiranjeevi registration of the family for future benefit.

8. On 2 October 2011, for the first time in the country, I had initiated the work of liberating the common man from the burden of costly treatment by launching **Mukhya Mantri Nishulk Dawa Yojana**. Going a step further, in the year 2013, we launched the **Mukhya Mantri Nishulk Janch Yojana** in Government Medical Institutions.

And now, I announce to making Outdoor (OPD) and Indoor (IPD) facilities completely free and cashless in all categories of government medical institutions for all residents of the state. Hence, in future, all treatment in government hospitals – Medical College Hospital, District Hospital, CHC, PHC and Sub Centre – will be completely free and cashless. For this, additional facilities for essential medicines and investigations will also be ensured in the hospitals.

- 9. The government, with the help of NGOs, is making concerted efforts to reduce road accidents. It is also the responsibility of the government to provide support to the family in case of an accident. In view of this, I also announce the **Mukhya Mantri Chiranjeevi Durghatna Bima Yojana.** Under this, an accident insurance cover upto Rs.5 lakh will also be available free-of-cost to the insured family under **Chiranjeevi Yojana**.
- 10. To provide timely medical facility to people close to home, 15 new hospitals are proposed to be constructed at a cost of more than Rs.1,224 crore, for 15 new medical colleges in the state. These will have a combined capacity of 3,674 beds. These hospitals are:

- 11. In the last budget, I had announced the opening of nursing colleges at all district headquarters. Currently, nursing colleges are functioning in 8 districts and work of setting up is in progress in 7 districts: Barmer, Bharatpur, Bhilwara, Dholpur, Pali, Karauli and Sikar. In the coming year, work will be undertaken to open nursing colleges in remaining 18 districts: Banswara, Baran, Bundi, Chittorgarh, Dausa, Dungarpur, Hanumangarh, Jaisalmer, Jalore, Jhalawar, Jhunjhunu, Nagaur, Pratapgarh, Rajsamand, SawaiMadhopur, Sirohi, Sriganganagar and Tonk.
- 12. For the expansion of medical facilities at SMS Medical College, Jaipur, 5 new departments will be set up along with facility for Robotic Surgery and Modular Operation Theaters. Along with this, various development works will be taken up in Jaipur-based Mahila Chikitsalaya, Sanganeri Gate; Janana Hospital and State Cancer Institute at a cost of Rs.300 crore.
- Rs.100 crore will be spent on strengthening and expansion of medical facilities in the medical colleges and hospitals of the state:
 - Construction of 100 beded medical block at District Hospital premises in Sikar and upgradation work will at TB Hospital-Bikaner, Mahatma Gandhi Hospital and Kamala Nehru Hospital-Jodhpur.
 - II. Construction of PG hostels at Medical College, Kota and Medical College, Bikaner, and construction of Girls' Hostel at Janana Hospital, Ajmer will be taken up.
- 14. In the coming year, new medical institutes will be established at Jaipur, Jodhpur, Ajmer and Kota at a cost of Rs.250 crore. These institutes are:
 - I. Institutes of Neuro Sciences and Opthalmology (SMS Medical College, Jaipur)
 - II. Institute of Neuro Sciences (SN Medical College, Jodhpur)
 - III. Institute of Paediatrics, Neonatology and Maternity (JK Lone Hospital, Kota)
 - IV. Institute of Paediatrics and Neonatology (JLN Medical College, Ajmer)
- Medical facilities for all 7 super specialty services Endocrinology, Gastroenterology, Gastrosurgery, Medical Oncology, Oncosurgery, Plastic

Surgery and Cardiology – will be made available at Medical Colleges, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Bikaner, Ajmer, Udaipur, Kota and Bharatpur.

A state-of-the-art cardiac lab will alo be established at MDM Hospital, Jodhpur.

- 16. Super specialty facilities in Neurology, Urology, Cardiology and Gastroenterology will be started in the medical colleges of Bhilwara, Barmer, Sikar, Dungarpur, Pali, Jhalawar and Churu in the coming year.
- Rajasthan University of Health Sciences (RUHS) and its affiliated Dental College, Jaipur will be completely revived at a cost of Rs. 100 crore.

Also, a new Dental College is proposed to be established at Jodhpur.

- 18. Providing better health services to residents of the state is our priority. Given the requests from the honourable members and for strengthening and expansion of the medical services infrastructure...
 - I. A provision of Rs.600 crore is proposed for the construction of buildings of District Hospital, Sub District Hospital, Community Health Center and Primary Health Center.
 - II. One thousand Sub Health Centres will be opened. It is proposed to open them on priority at the newly formed gram panchayat headquarters.
 - III. 100 Primary Health Centres are proposed to be opened including upgradation of 50 Sub Centres to Primary Health Centres.
 - IV. The following Primary Health Centres (PHCs) will be upgraded to Community Health Centers (CHC): Machadi (Raini) in Alwar, Ramsar (Srinagar) in Ajmer, Mandali (Kalyanpur), Bhadkha in Barmer, Koyla in Baran, Kalsada (Bayana), Bahnera (Sever)-Bharatpur, Antali (Badnore), Gyangarh (Kareda) in Bhilwara, Goddu (Bajju) in Bikaner, Tamtia (Sagwara) in Dungarpur, Dadrewa (Rajgarh) in Churu, Daulatpura (Lalsot) in Dausa, Dhanota (Shahpura), Banethi (Kotputli), Dhankya (Jhotwara), Badwa (Bassi) in Jaipur, Bar (Raipur), Busi (Rani) in Pali, Jhallara in Udaipur, Randhai (Mandrayal) in Karauli, Minda (Nawan), Dhankauli (Didwana), Sudrasan (Maulasar) in Nagaur, Sukar

(Bamanwas), Phalodi (Khandar) in Sawai Madhopur, Anadra (Reodar) in Sirohi, Patoda (Laxmangarh) in Sikar, Arayan (Shrikaranpur) in Sriganganagar, Bapawar (Sangod) in Kota, Chhani (Nayagaon) in Udaipur and Meghana (Nohar) in Hanumangarh (PHC). In addition, Urban Primary Health Center, Chhapar (Sujangarh) in Churu and Udaymandir in Jodhpur will be upgraded to Urban Community Health Center (CHC).

- V. Navchokiya Dispensary-Jodhpur will be upgraded into a Satellite hospital.
- VI. Community health centers of Dhorimana, Chohtan in Barmer, Nainwa in Bundi, Begun, Rawatbhata in Chittorgarh, Sikrai, Bandikui, Mahwa in Dausa, Bansur in Alwar, Sadulshahar in Sriganganagar, Poogal (Khajuwala) in Bikaner, Anta in Baran, Nagar in Bharatpur and Jayal in Nagaur will be upgraded to sub-district hospitals.
- VII. The Sub-District Hospitals of Nathdwara in Rajsamand, Behror in Alwar, Didwana in Nagaur, Ratangarh in Churu, Lalsot in Dausa and Nawalgarh in Jhunjhunu will be upgraded to District Hospitals.
- VIII. Blood banks will be set up in Bari-Dholpur, Hindaun City in Karauli, Gangrar in Chittorgarh and Deoli in Tonk.
- IX. It is proposed to establish one additional CMHO office each at Jodhpur and Udaipur.
- 19. Currently, Dialysis facility is provided in 34 district hospitals of the state. To expand this facility in remote areas, I announce to start this facility in a phased manner at Sub-District Hospitals and Community Health Centers (CHCs) at 352 panchayat samiti headquarters. Along with this, dental facilities will also be made available in a phased manner at all these centers.
- 20. To provide Early Cancer Detection facility for the women in remote areas of the state, I announce the provision of Mobile Cancer Diagnostic Van for each district at a cost of Rs.50 crore.
- 21. AYUSH Hospitals will be established at 19 blocks deprived of AYUSH facilities (Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani and Homeopathy) at a

cost of Rs.20 crore.

22. Ayurveda College will be opened in Taranagar-Churu and Ayurveda Nursing College in Bharatpur. Along with this expansion Unani College building in Tonk will be undertaken at accost of Rs.20 crore.

SHUDH KE LIYE YUDH

23. The Government is committed to protecting the interests of consumers. With the aim of providing pure and high-quality food items to residents of the state. **'Shudh ke liye Yudh'** campaign is run from time to time. To make this effective, 200 new posts are proposed to be created for Food Safety Officers through recruitment under the existing **Directorate of Food Safety**. Additionally, provision will be made for of 10 new functional Mobile Food Safety Labs while expediting the completion of 7 Food Safety Labs announced earlier.

ROAD SAFETY

- 24. Road accidents are on a rise owing to increasing traffic pressure on the roads. This is a matter of concern. In order to prevent loss of lives due to such accidents, strict action is necessary on incidence of violation of rules and drunk driving, besides regular training of drivers. Towards further enhancing road safety to reduce accidents...
 - 'Rajasthan Public Transport Authority' will be constituted by bringing in the Road Safety Act. Additionally, a State Road Safety Institute will be opened at HCM RIPA, Jaipur.
 - II. Sections from Shahjahanpur to Ajmer (NH-48 and NH-448), Bar-Bilara-Jodhpur (NH-25) and Sikar to Bikaner (NH-11 and NH-52) will be developed as an accident free road as a pilot project.

EDUCATION & SPORTS

25. Our efforts have resulted in qualitative improvement in standard of education in government schools in the state. I'm glad to share that enrollment of children in the age group of 6-14 years in state's government schools in 2021 has increased by about 20 per cent as compared to the year 2018. This calls for continuous upgradation of government schools. I

announce to upgrade all 3,820 secondary schools of the state to senior secondary schools.

26. In today's globalised scenario, to be able to compete at national and international levels, it is becoming increasingly necessary for the students of the state to be proficient in English language as well.

Keeping this in mind, we have sanctioned / started 1200 Mahatma Gandhi English Schools in all the villages with population more than 5000. Considering the popularity of and demand among parents and students for admission in these schools, 1000 more Mahatma Gandhi English Medium Schools will be opened in urban and rural areas in the coming year.

- 27. To ensure the quality of education in English medium, I announce creation of a separate cadre (cadre-within-cadre) of English medium teachers in all subjects. In the first phase, around 10 thousand English medium teachers will be recruited in these schools.
- 28. For the strengthening and development of basic education in rural and remote areas of the state...
 - I. Primary schools will be opened on priority in Gram Panchayats devoid of primary schools.
 - II. Districts in desert region Jaisalmer, Barmer, Bikaner, Churu, Jodhpur have remote hamlets. A large number of proposals have been received from public representatives of these areas to open new primary schools. For widespread expansion of primary education in these regions, 200 primary schools will be opened in the first phase, providing relaxation in the rules and standards.
 - III. Primary schools located at village panchayat headquarters will be upgraded to upper primary schools and upper primary schools will be upgraded directly to senior secondary schools as per the standards and requirements set by the education department.
 - IV. To provide education facility to girls close to home and to reduce dropouts, 389 secondary, 1846 upper primary and 115 primany girls schools in the state will be upgraded in order of preference, in a phased manner.

Also, infrastructure expansion including construction of classrooms will be taken up as per requirement.

- 29. In order to develop infrastructure facility in government schools, construction of more than 3 thousand 800 class rooms, laboratories, library, art and craft, computer rooms etc., construction of 20 new buildings and major repair works in 100 schools will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 200 crore.
- 30. I announce integration of various educational institutions located on Jawaharlal Nehru (JLN) Marg of Jaipur to develop them as an 'Education Hub'. For this, a provision of Rs.400 crore is proposed in the next two years, of which –
 - I. Rs. 225 crore on Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Governance and Social Sciences (MGIGSS),
 - II. Rs.100 crore on Raja Ramdev Poddar Residential School of Excellence, and
 - III. Rs.75 crore on Radhakrishna Library and Coaching Centre.
- 31. To provide better higher education facilities to the girls in the state, I announce opening of 36 girls' colleges in 19 districts of the state, which are as follows:

Also, Government Girls' College, Taranagar in Churu and Sarwar in Ajmer will be upgraded to PG College. Apart from this, new subjects/faculties are also proposed to be opened in 25 girls' colleges.

- 32. In the memory of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first education minister of the country, a Center of Excellence and Research in Maulana Azad University, Jodhpur will be established for research on social harmony and amity at a cost of Rs. 15 crore.
- 33. I announce setting up of an Engineering College at Khaitan Polytechnic College Campus, Jaipur at a cost of Rs.100 crore. Additionally, Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) will be opened at Agolai (Shergarh) in Jodhpur, Arai (Kishangarh) in Ajmer and Uchhain (Nadbai) in Bharatpur.
- 34. Under the Mukhya Mantri Anupriti Coaching Yojana launched by us earlier, more than 7 thousand students have been benefitted this year. In the coming year, expanding the scope of this scheme, I propose to provide benefit to 15000 students. Apart from coaching, in order to provide the facility of a congenial environment for studies, I announce to establish

Savitri Bai Phule Reading Room in each district at a cost of Rs.50 lakhs each. In these reading rooms, necessary facilities of magazines, books, computer, internet, etc. will also be made available to the youth preparing for competitive examinations by themselves (Self study). Sumer Public Library, Jodhpur will be modernised and reconstructed at a cost of about Rs.42 crore.

- 35. The library of Shri Hindi Sahitya Samiti located in Bharatpur is unique in itself. Its conservation and preservation has become necessary in the present scenario. In the 2013-14 budget, I had sanctioned a grant of Rs.50 lakh for this institution. Now, taking this library under government protection, I propose to give a grant of Rs.5 crore for its modernisation and promotion.
- 36. For promoting higher education, our government has opened 123 colleges in the last 3 years. To expand the facilities of higher education, it is necessary to encourage higher educational institutions in the private sector as well while ensuring quality. Currently, applications of private educational institutions in the fields of agriculture, veterinary, nursing, medical and technical, etc. are pending and our Government is committed for proper disposal of these. With this view, by ensuring complete transparency, the applications of the institutions fulfilling the norms will be disposed off in 2 months. To ensure time-bound disposal in future, an online process is proposed to be set up.
- 37. I propose setting up of a **Residential Para Sports Academy** at Jaipur and Jodhpur with Rs.20 crore each for higher technical training, equipment and practice facility for para sports players. Along with this, I announce to implement the provision of allotment of 25 *bighas* of agricultural land free-of-cost for medal winners of Paralympic Games as it is for Olympic medal winners.
- 38. In order to develop Sports facilities in the state...
 - The stadium in Bharatpur will be developed with a view to encouraging traditional sports like wrestling/kabaddi. Along with this, development works of Navan-Nagaur and Rawatbhata-Chittorgarh stadium will be

undertaken at a cost of Rs. I 2 crore.

- II. Multipurpose Indoor Stadium will be built in Tonk.
- III. Sport Stadiums will be buit in Girwa in Udaipur, Keru (Luni) in Jodhpur, Hindaun in Karauli, Dhod in Sikar, Parbatsar in Nagaur, Parasrampura (Nawalgarh) in Jhunjhunu, Bansur in Alwar, Rupwas (Bayana), Uchchain (Nadbai) in Bharatpur, Taranagar in Churu and Bagru in Jaipur.
- IV. The College of Physical Education in Jodhpur will be expanded and upgraded and Rajasthan State Sports Institute will be established under the Sports Department at a cost of Rs. 15 crore.
- V. Rajasthan High Performance Sports Training and Rehabilitation Center will be built at a cost of Rs.10 crore in Jodhpur on the lines of Sawai Mansingh Stadium of Jaipur.
- VI. Synthetic athletic track will be built at Sawai Mansingh Stadium-Jaipur and Maharana Pratap Khelgaon-Udaipur at a cost of Rs. 15 crore.
- VII. Construction of building of Kabaddi Academy at Rajgarh (Sadulpur), Churu and Athletics Academy at Sri Ganganagar will be undertaken.

VIII. Sports hostel will be constructed at Chaurasi-Dungarpur.

39. It is proposed to send government employees 'On Duty' to participate in state, national and international level sports competitions. Along with this, I also propose to give appointment to officer/employee working with any other state or central government on an equivalent post in the state with Pay Protection on winning a medal.

YOUTH AND EMPLOYMENT

40. Honourable Speaker, Today, I would like to call upon the youth power of the state to remind them of statement of Swami Vivekananda:

"Young generation has the power of a lion to fight difficulties."

We have always worked to empower youth and hone their talents to help them become successful in their lives and for to play an important role in nation building. I would like to draw the attention of the honourable house to this statement of former Prime Minister **Indira Gandhi ji**, who always

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inspired to strive ceaselessly with a fighting spirit:

"Opportunities are not offered; they must be wrested, and worked for. And this calls for perserverance...and courage."

- 41. Honourable House will be glad to know that to facilitate lodging for youth of low income group of the State in Delhi for coaching and career councelling for a brigher future, I announce building a 250-room Nehru Youth Transit Hostel and Facilitation Centre for 500 persons at Delhi based 'Udaipur House' at the cost of Rs.300 crore.
- 42. In order to provide Plug & Play facility at affordable rates to the Service Sector, MSMEs and Startups, I announce to set up 'Rajiv Gandhi Knowledge Service & Innovation Hubs' in Jaipur, Jodhpur and Kota with an investment of Rs.200 crore each. Provision will be separately made in these Hubs for women as 'W-Hub'.
- 43. I propose to start 'Mukhya Mantri Work from Home Job Work Yojana' for such women who can contribute to the livelihood of their family through 'Work from Home'. It is proposed to benefit 20 thousand women in the coming year. About Rs. 100 crore will be spent on this.
- 44. With a view to encouraging activities related to Bharat Scouts and Guides in the state, the 18th National Bharat Scout Guide Jamboree will be organissed in Rohat-Pali. About 25000 national and international scouts / guides will participate in this event. Rs.25 crore will be spent on this.
- 45. To develop scientific temper among the general public, especially the youth, Science Centres will be set up at Bikaner, Bharatpur and Kota at a cost of about Rs.75 crore.
- 46. Our government is committed to conducting recruitments in a time bound manner with complete transparency. For this, a two-tier (eligibility and selection) recruitment system is proposed to be adopted for various recruitments including REET. Recently REET exam had to be canceled due to breach of confidentiality. Now, I propose to conduct REET examination in July 2022. For this afresh examination, no application fee will be charged from the old enrolled candidates and all the facilities provided to the candidates earlier at the time of REET examination will be provided again.

Number of posts in the upcoming REET exam will be increased from 32,000 to 62,000 to provide more employment opportunities to youth of the state,.

- 47. To curb the irregularities happening in recruitment examinations, an **Anti Cheating Cell** will be constituted in SOG.
- 48. During our tenure, more than one lakh youths have been given appointment so far and recruitment process is underway or about 1.25 lakh posts. It is worth mentioning here that in the 5-year tenure of the previous government, about 2 lakh recruitments were done, whereas we have reached this number in just 3 years. Now, I announce recruitment for **about one lakh additional posts** in various departments in the coming year.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT

Honourable Speaker, as our state being Industry friendly, is a leading choice for national and international investors. The success of our efforts can be gauged from the enthusiasm shown by investors in **'Invest Rajasthan-2022'**. We have also inspired the Rajasthani diaspora living within the country and abroad to reconnect with their State through 'Rajasthan Foundation'.

49. Out of 147 subdivisions in the state devoid of an industrial area, in the year 2021-22, industrial areas were announced to be set up in 64 subdivisions in the first phase. Work of developing these has already started at a fast pace. In the coming year, 32 industrial areas will be established, which are as follows:

- 50. Multi Storied Industrial Complexes will be developed in Salarpur Industrial Area in Greater Bhiwadi and Boranada in Jodhpur at a cost of Rs.250 crore each for setting up technology-based industries. IT, ITeS, Readymade Garments, Jewellery and Service sector units will be established with Plug-&-Play facilities in these campuses. An additional Inland Dry Port will be established at Jodhpur.
- 51. In the coming year, through RIICO, development works worth Rs.150 crore will be undertaken in 20 industrial areas including Bhiwadi city, Greater Bhiwadi, Marwar Industrial Area, Jodhpur-Pali, Sitapura-Jaipur, Boranada-Jodhpur and Pali. Along with this, to solve drainage problem in Bhiwadi city and industrial area, a mega project will be started at a cost of Rs.100 crore.
- 52. Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemicals Investment Region (PCPIR) will be established over an area of 383 sq km at Pachpadra in Barmer. Rs.1000 crore will be spent for its basic infrastructural development in a phased manner through RIICO. It will provide employment to 1.40 lakh people.

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Industrial units to be established in this area will also be benefited under RIPS.

53. In order to provide a congenial and safe environment to industrial units in the state, **Rajasthan Industrial Security Force (RISF)** will be constituted in the state on the lines of **Central Industrial Security Force (CISF)**. In the coming year, 2,000 security personnel will be recruited under this.

SOCIAL SECURITY

We have been making tireless efforts to provide support to the backward, disadvantaged and helpless sections of the society. I believe that in a democracy the formost responsibility of an elected government is to end prevailing inequalities in the society, making the life of needy sections/persons happy and prosperous by imparting to them an opportunity to live a life of dignity. I would like to quote the words of social worker, Baba Amte-

"I don't want to be a great leader; I want to be a man who is content with a little, and also helps people when they are suffering. The man who does this is certainly greater than any holy man. This is the ideal of my life."

- 54. In the year 2021-22, I had announced implementation of special Rajasthan Pattern for all round development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and setting up of a development fund of Rs. 100 crore for each. I am glad to inform the Honourable House that in this Assembly session, we are presenting the 'Rajasthan State SC and ST Development Fund (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Bill'. Also, I announce to increase the amount of SC and ST development fund from Rs.100 crore each to Rs.500 crore each in the coming year. Utilisation under each Fund is proposed as follows:
 - Rs.200 crore for employment-oriented activities and agriculture,
 - Rs. I 50 crore for education and social security, and
 - Rs. I 50 crore for infrastructure and public participation related works.
- 55. To provide opportunities for economic progress to the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) families of general category, I announce the

formation of an **EWS Fund** of Rs.100 crore. Under this, works related to education, employment, infrastructure, etc. will be undertaken.

- 56. To provide quality food at affordable rates to the disadvantaged, laborers and people coming from outside in urban areas and big towns, we had launched 'Indira Rasoi Yojana'. Currently 358 Indira Rasois are functioning. Considering the popularity and utility of these, I announce to increase the number of Indira Rasoi to 1000. An annual expenditure of Rs.250 crore is estimated on this.
- 57. I announce to increase the number of scooties given under the Mukhya Mantri Divyang Scooty Yojana to the specially-abled college going students and to youth going to their workplace for employment from 2000 this year to 5000 in the coming year. Also, under the 'Kali Bai Bhil' and 'Devnarayan' Yojana, I announce to increase the number of scooties given annually to meritorious girl students from 13 thousand to 20 thousand. An expenditure of Rs.170 crore is estimated on these.
- 58. I announce establishment of Baba Amte Divyang University at Jamdoli-Jaipur for higher education, research and availability of teachers for the specially-abled. Also, Netraheen Vikas Sansthan, Jodhpur will be upgraded to a college. Rs.15 crore will be spent on the establishment of these two institutions. Apart from this, I announce to increase the subsidy for salary and allowances given to the schools, residential schools run by NGOs for the specially-abled from 90% to 100%.
- 59. In the last budget, I had announced the **Beghar Uthan Avum Puraniwas Niti**, which is now ready. A provision of Rs.50 crore is proposed under this Policy in the coming year. Under this, a survey for people living in streets in rural and urban areas will be undertaken and Jan Aaadhar cards will be issued to them. Along with this, employment, social security and rehabilitation related work will be undertaken for them.
- 60. To provide residential institutions for homeless, aged people, working women and destitutes in the state, **Mukhya Mantri Punarvas Grah Yojana** is proposed on the lines of 'Apna Ghar' institution. Under this, resettlement homes will be constructed in each district as per requirement and will be

run through selected institutions. The work of setting up 45 residential facilities with capacity of 75 each will be undertaken in the coming year. A provision of Rs.90 crore is proposed for this.

- 61. Support and economic and social upliftment works will be undertaken for Mirasi (Mirasi, Dhadhi, Mir, Manganiyar, Damami, Nagarchi, Langa, Rana) and Bhishti communityies in the state, at a cost of Rs.20 crore.
- 62. Our government is ceaselessly working for upliftment of the labourers. For welfare of and relief to construction labourers, I announce to ensure the payment of all pending cases post 2017 at district level under 'Construction Worker Cess Fund' within a time period of 3 months with the help of District Collector, officers along with NGOs/Civil Society.
- 63. In the year 2020-21, I had started 'Indira Gandhi Matritva Poshan Yojana' for Pratapgarh, Banswara, Udaipur, Dungarpur and Baran districts. Under this, an assistance of Rs.6,000 is provided on the birth of the second child. Now, I announce extending this scheme to the entire state. This will benefit about 3.5 lakh pregnant women every year. Rs.210 crore will be spent on this.
- 64. I announce to increase the current assistance under Palanhar Yojana from Rs.500 per month to Rs.1,000 per month for orphan children of 0-6 years age group and from Rs.1,000 per month to Rs.2,500 per month for 6-18 years of age-group. Around 14,000 children will be benefited under this at a cost of Rs.20 crore.
- 65. To provide quality education facilities to the students of Non-Scheduled Tribe Area (Non-TSP) of western Rajasthan, I announce to set up a Tribal residential school for 400 students at a cost of Rs.30 crore in Jodhpur. Also, Tribal Hostels will be started at Beda (Bali) - Pali, Sirohi, Jalore, Barmer and Jaisalmer will be made operational.
- 66. It is proposed to open Scheduled Caste Girls' Hostel at Uchhain-Bharatpur, Scheduled Caste Boys' Hostel at Pratapgarh and Parbatsar-Nagaur, Devnarayan Girls' Hostel at Begun-Chittorgarh, and Devnarayan Boys' Hostel at Khurikalan-Dausa in the coming year. Also, hostel buildings will be constructed at scheduled caste hostels being run at Radawas-Jaipur and Heinsla (Thanagaji)-Alwar.

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- 67. To promote education of girl child, Savitri Bai Phule Girls Hostel will be opened. Under this, hostels will be opened at Jaisalmer, Chordi-Dausa, Nagola (Bhinay)-Ajmer, Tonk, Balotra-Barmer and Chitalwana (Sanchore)-Jalore in the coming year.
- 68. Various works such as infrastructure, educational development and expansion of facilities will be undertaken for upliftmet of minorities. These are as follows:
 - 7 Minority Boys' and Girls' Residential School buildings will be constructed at Churu, Sawai Madhopur, Nagaur, Fatehpur-Sikar and Block Tijara-Alwar, Ghadsana-Sriganganagar and Sam-Jaisalmer at a cost of about Rs. 180 crore.
 - II. Contruction of building for minority girls' hostels at Ghadsana-Sriganganagar, Bhilwara and Ajmer and minority boys' hostels Ladnun-Nagaur, Gangapur City-Sawai Madhopur, Pali, Pahari (Kaman)-Bharatpur and Alwar will be undertaken at a cost of Rs.20 crore.
 - III. Smart classrooms along with internet facility are proposed for registered madrasas in a phased manner. In the coming year, smart class rooms will be made in 500 madrasas in the first phase.
 - IV. Construction of second floor and expansion work will be undertaken at Haj House, Jaipur.
- 69. At some places families of genuinely needy, low income category are deprived of receiving wheat under 'Food Security Act'. I announce addition of about 10 lakh new families to NFSA (National Food Security Act) eligiblity list by including the enlisted families in appeals received till January 31, 2022 and other left out families.

INFRASTRUCTURE; ROADS AND PLANNED DEVELOPMENT

70. Roads are an important important component of State's infrastructure. Honourable members of the House have submitted proposals for roads in large numbers. Development of roads is our priority, but it is not possible to build all the proposed roads at once. However, we are committed to building roads in every area in a phased manner as per requirement. 71. In the last budget, a total of 99 major repair works on 3 major highways of each district were announced at a cost of Rs.1,900 crore. Work is under progress on these. Based on positive feedback received from the districts, I announce major repair and upgradation work of 3 important damaged highways of each district at a cost of Rs.3,133 crore in the coming year. - 72. A provision of Rs.5 crore was made for road related works in every assembly constituency in the last budget. I announce to increase this sum to **Rs.10 crore for each assembly constituency** in the coming year. Rs.7 crore will be provided for non-patachable/damaged roads and Rs.3 crore for construction of missing link roads in rural areas. A provision of Rs.2,000 crore will be made for this.
- 73. Many urban bodies in the state do not have adequate financial resources. Therefore, like in last year's budget, major repair works of main roads 40 km in every municipal corporation, 25 km in every city council and 15 km in every municipality are proposed to be carried out through Public Works Department. About Rs. 1,200 crore will be spent on this.
- 74. Of the 4000 km State Highway which is not two-lane, 1000 km will be made two-lane in the first phase at a cost of Rs. 1,200 crore.
- 75. The Central Government has included four urban areas of the state Jaipur, Ajmer, Kota and Udaipur – under Smart City Mission. In view of holistic development of remaining divisional headquarters of the state – Jodhpur, Bikaner and Bharatpur – along with the cities of Alwar, Bhilwara and Chittorgarh, I announce to implement **Rajasthan Smart City Scheme** with a provision of Rs. 1,500 crore in the next two years.
- 76. In our last tenure, the foundation of a new era in the field of public transport was laid by us in the form of Jaipur Metro. Currently, Metro is operational from Mansarovar to Badi Chapad. Now, I announce the extension of Jaipur Metro joining Badi Chaupad to Transport Nagar (Phase I-C) on Delhi-Agra Highway and up to Ajmer Road (Phase I-D) on 200 feet bypass from Mansarovar. An expenditure of Rs. I, 185 crore will be made on this. Also, a fresh DPR is proposed to be prepared for the second phase of Jaipur Metro –Sitapura to Ambabadi.
- 77. Looking at increasing population load in State capital, Jaipur, work on a long term development plan must be started with immediate action on a plan for developing new Satellite Towns. Also, it is proposed to prepare a master plan for satellite towns like Chaksu, Bassi, Chaimun, Bagru, Fagi and Chandwaji, and preparing a DPR to connect them through metro/light rail.

- 78. To provide better facilities to passengers, Central Bus Stand, Sindhi Camp will be developed as Multimodal Integrated ISBT Hub and Satellite Bus Terminals will be made on Sikar Road, Ajmer Road, Agra Road, Tonk Road and Delhi Road. These will cost around Rs.750 crore. Also, Rs.125 crore is proposed to be spent on works related to upgradation and repair of stands of Roadways (RSRTC) and private buses.
- 79. Various construction works will be undertaken in cities of the state at a cost of about Rs.525 crore which are as follows:

- 80. Beautification and other infrastructural works will be done in Nathdwara-Rajsamand, Pushkar-Ajmer, Pilani-Jhunjhunu and Mount Abu-Sirohi at a cost of Rs. 160 crore.
- 81. To strengthen the drainage plan in Jaipur, works will be undertaken on Goner Road Nala, Vande Mataram Road, Jaisinghpura Bhankrota Road Ka Nala, Jagatpura and Bainad Road at a cost of Rs. 142 crore. Also, work will be undertaken to clean the filthy streets of walled city of Jaipur.
- 82. Drainage and other basic works will be undertaken in Nawalgarh-Jhunjhunu, Sagwara-Dungarpur, Bhavani Mandi-Jhalawar and Bundi at a cost of Rs.300 crore.
- 83. In view of increasing load of urban population, it would be appropriate to allot government land in rural areas adjoining the cities to the urban body. A Policy is proposed to be announced for this. Towards this, I announce to provide 76 bighas of land of Kadana area free of cost to the Municipality of Sagwara-Dungarpur.
- 84. Development assistance for Dang Area Development Board, Mewat Area Development Board and Magra Area Development Board is proposed to be increased from Rs.10 crore each to Rs.25 crore each in the coming year. Also, I propose to start the Mukhya Mantri Shetriya gramin Vikas Yojana for systematic infrastructural and rural development in the remote and backward areas of the state. Under this, a provision of Rs.100 crore will be made in the coming year.
- 85. With a view to develop well-planned development and better
infrastructure, I announce the constitution of Development Authority in Udaipur and Kota.

DRINKING WATER AND WATER RESOURCES

- 86. Honorable Speaker, almost the entire terra firma of our state is faces adverse situation in terms of availability and quality of water. Considering the importance of door-step delivery of water, despite Corona pandemic, we have executed works under the scheme at a rapid pace and contributing our equal share. The house will be glad to know that projects costing more than Rs.60,600 crore have been approved, which will benefit 35 thousand 776 villages. Under this scheme, water connections will be provided to 86.21 lakh households.
- 87. To provide water connection to every household under Jal Jeevan Mission, preparation of DPR of 35 projects was announced. Out of these work has commenced on 11 projects. In the coming year, work on 24 projects worth about Rs.13,921 crore will start, to make pure drinking water available to more than 12.24 lakh houses in 5,833 villages of the state. These projects are:

- 89. Likewise, under Jal Jeevan Mission, I propose to prepare DPR for the work of Regional water supply project in the coming year to provide doorstep water to 554 villages of Pratapgarh, Arnod and Peepalkhunt area in Pratapgarh, from Jakham dam. About Rs. 1,620 crore will be spent on this project.
- 90. In the year 2022-23, DPR of Regional Water Supply Project will be prepared to benefit people of 1,899 villages of Udaipur, Chittorgarh and Rajsamand districts through Har Ghar Jal Connection under Jal Jeevan Mission.
- 91. In order to ensure drinking water supply in Pali and Sirohi districts, I announce construction of Buja and Chak Sandmaria dams in Kotada tehsil of Udaipur at a cost of Rs. 1,800 crore. Rs. 1,200 crore will be spent to bring water from these dams to Jawai Dam.
- 92. Under the Mount Abu Urban Drinking Water Scheme, construction of dam in Salgaon-Sirohi along with other works is proposed to be undertaken. It will cost around Rs.250 crore. Also, works worth Rs.106 crore will be done for drinking water in Nimbahera-Chittorgarh.

ENERGY

93. Honorable Speaker, famous human rights activist Ella Baker had said:

'Give light and people will find the way'

Bringing this though to life, we have tried to lighten up lives of variou sections by reducing the rate of electricity through grants. Along with this,

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we have also worked on increasing power generation capacity and strengthening the energy system.

94. In order to reduce the cost of electricity generation and carbon emissions:

Chhabra Thermal Power Station will be expanded and two units of 660-660 MW based ultra supercritical technology will be established at a cost of more than Rs.9,600 crore.

Expanding the Kalisindh-Jhalawar Thermal Power Project, a third unit of 800 MW based on ultra supercritical technology will be established.

- 95. A 125 MW lignite coal based thermal power project will be set up at Gudha-Bikaner at a cost of Rs.950 crore.
- 96. In order to reduce the 'Operational Loss' (AT&C Loss) in the power distribution system of the state, various works will be taken up in the next two years under the Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS), which are as follows:

Prepaid smart meters of 48 lakh consumers will be installed by spending Rs.3,565 crore.

The basic infrastructure of power distribution will be strengthened at a cost of about Rs.3,500 crore.

- 97. To strengthen the distribution system in the state, in view the increasing demand for energy:
 - 400 KV grid sub-stations are proposed to be set up in Dholpur and Udaipur. Rs.650 crore will be spent on these.
 - II. 132 KV GSS of Bari-Dholpur and Sikri-Bharatpur will be upgraded to 220 KV GSS.
 - III. 132 KV GSS will be built up at Chhatraul-Jaisalmer, Bayana-Bharatpur, Chardi-Dausa, Datina (Khivsar)-Nagaur, Ajnoti-Sawai Madhopur and Masalpur, Cuttack-Karauli.
- IV. 33 KV GSS will be built at Parveni (Rajgarh) Alwar, Nagdani Phanta Gida (Chahatan), Chandesara (Pachpadra) - Barmer, Dhakhar Khedi (Mandalgarh) - Bhilwara, Khurikalan - Dausa, Navan (Sadulpur) - Churu,

Khedli (Rajakheda) - Dholpur, Kulchasar (Nohar) Hanumangarh, Birasana (Jamwaramgarh)-Jaipur, Daboli Mithi (Degana)-Nagaur, Nibhera (Bayana)-Bharatpur, Rampuria (Digod)-Kota, Dabur (Neemkathana)-Sikar and Syawata (Deoli)- Tonk.

FOREST AND ENVIRONMENT

- 98. In order to increase forest cover and vegetation in the state, it is proposed to plant trees in more than 50 thousand hectares of forest area in the coming year.
- 99. On the lines of World Forestry Garden (Jhalana Dungri), Jaipur, **Botanical Gardens** will be set up at Jodhpur, Bikaner, Kota, Udaipur, Bharatpur and Ajmer at a cost of Rs.30 crore.
- 100. 'Sambhar Lake Management Project' will be started with the view of Integrated Management, Development and Conservation of Sambhar Lake, an internationally renowned Ramsar site. For this, a provision of Rs.10 crore is proposed for the coming year.
- 101. For the adoption of wildlife fauna in Zoological Park-Zoo by the general public, organizations, corporates, zoophiles, etc. Captive Animal Sponsorship Scheme will be launched.
- 102. Contemporary wildlife disease diagnosis and rescue centres will be developed in a phased manner in all the zoological parks and zoos of the state. In the first phase, such centres will be set up at Nahargarh Biological Park, Jaipur and Machia Biological Park, Jodhpur. An estimated expenditure of Rs.10 crore will be incurred on this.
- 103. In order to ensure proper disposal of e-waste, along with 'e-Waste Disposal Policy', 'e-Waste Recycling Park' is proposed to be established in Jaipur. Provision of an initial investment of Rs.50 crore will be made by the state.

TOURISM, ART & CULTURE

104. In the year 2021-22, we constituted **Paryatan Vikas Kosh** worth Rs.500 crore, but schedule work under this fund is still at the initial stage due to Corona Pandemic. Compensating for the same, with a view to give impetus to tourism related works, I announce to increase the amount of

Paryatan Vikas Kosh to Rs. 1000 crore. Of this, Rs.400 crore will be spent for branding the state as a Tourism destination, which will include media plan, events, concerts, etc. and Rs.600 crore will be spent for infrastructure related works at tourist sites /circuits.

105. For development of Tourism in the State:

- 1. Two tourist places in each district will be identified for works related to public convenience worth worth Rs. 100 crore in the coming year.
- 2. DPR will be prepared for complete renovation of Khasa Koti to develop a 100-room capacity 'State Guest House' at a cost of Rs.5 crore.
- Intra-State Air Service will be reoperated connecting locations depending on demand and feasibility. An annual expenditure of Rs. 15 crore will be incurred on this.
- 4. To promote adventure tourism activities Adventure Tourism Promotion Scheme will be launched.
- 5. In order to provide facilities to tourists, an Integrated online booking portal and Mobile App will be developed at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.
- 6. 500 'Tourist Mitras' will be recruited for important tourist destinations to help and ensure safety of tourists.
- 106. To promote tourism in Dungarpur and Banswara region, Vagad tourist circuit will be developed by including tourist and religious sites of Mangarhdham-Devsomnath-Beneshwar-Galiakot-Arthuna-Tripura Sundari Kadana-Mahi Bajaj Sagar-Kagadi Pickup-Ghotia Amba-etc.
- 107. Rajiv Gandhi Central Park will be constructed on Ranthambore Road in Sawai Madhopur at a cost of Rs.15 crore. Also, to facilitate the pilgrims, DPR of ropeway will be prepared for Trinetra Ganesh Temple, Ranthambore-Sawai Madhopur and Rameshwar Mahadev Temple, Akoda (Hindoli)-Bundi Temple at a cost of Rs.5 crore.
- 108. A 'Vedic Gurukul' will be established at Govind Guru Tribal University, Banswara at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.
- 109. Provision will be made to increase the honorarium and other allowances given to folk artists by up to 25 percent.

LAW AND ORDER

Today, there is rise in insecurity, tension and distrust in the country on religious and social issues. Indian culture has always believed in the spirit of "Sarv Dharm Sambhav" and we have imbibed the idea of "Vasudev Kutumbkam". In the present scenario, along with the government, there is a need for all responsible organisations, eminent people and the common man to unite and make relentless efforts to maintain social harmony.

110. To further strengthen law and order in the state and to effectively control crime:

I announce the constitution of 500 Police Mobile Units connecting them with Abhay Command Centre, Dial 100/ Dial 112 on the lines of 108 Ambulance in the coming year.

The number of cameras attached to Abhay Command and Control Centre will be increased from 10 thousand to 30 thousand. Also, CCTV cameras will be installed mandatorily at big private institutions and commercial centres and a plan will be prepared to connect them with Abhay Command and Control Centre.

Center for Cyber Security will be set up at a cost of Rs.50 crore for public awareness, prevention of cyber crimes and strengthening security of digital ecosystem against cyber threats. I also announce the opening of **Cyber Police Stations** in all districts of the state.

In the coming year...

Office of the Additional Superintendent of Police will be opened at Pokaran-Jaisalmer, Hindaun-Karauli and Kaman-Bharatpur.

New Police Check posts will be opened at Nathusar Valley - Bikaner, Kasarwadi (Sajjangarh), Gangdtalai - Banswara, Bhadasar (Sardarshahr) -Churu, Bhandarej (Sikrai) - Dausa, Pilwa (Lohawat), Sekhala (Shergarh), Lalsagar (Mandor) - Jodhpur, Gothda (Hindoli) – Bundi, Surpalia (Jayal), Lunwan (Nawa)-Nagaur, Jajod (Khandela)-Sikar, Bhanda (Khairwara)-Udaipur, Shrinathji Temple (Nathdwara), Kumbhalgarh Fort (Kelwara)-Rajsamand and Tunkra (Jaitaran)- Pali. In addition, an Anti-Narcotics Post will be set up at Malarampur (Sangaria)-Hanumangarh.

Police checkposts will be upgraded to police stations at Sone Ka Gurja (Bari) – Dholpur, Jhapada (Lalsot) – Dausa, Bagad Tiraya (Ramgarh), Akbarpur – Alwar, Rajtalab – Banswara, Dhanau (Chahtan), Rico Region – Barmer, Raithal – Bundi, Saroda – Dungarpur, Phefana (Nowhar)-Hanumangarh, Bindayka-Jaipur, Chamu (Shergarh)-Jodhpur, Ranpur-Kota, Mitrapura (Bamanwas), Kundera-Sawai Madhopur, Jeenmata-Sikar, Bar (Raipur)-Pali and Patiya (Khairwara)-Udaipur.

New police stations will be opened in Bishangarh (Sanchair) - Jalore, Pali (Chhabra) - Baran and Kaprada (Bilara) - Jodhpur.

Offices of Deputy Superintendents of Police will be opened at Masuda-Ajmer, Kathumar-Alwar, Uchhain (Nadbai)-Bharatpur, Ladnun-Nagaur, Bidasar (Sujangarh)-Churu, Dantaramgarh-Sikar and Jobner-Jaipur.

Construction works of various approved police units including Bhiwadi Police Line will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 100 crore.

- 111. To provide proper environment and facilities to captives living in prisons, enhancement of facilities and necessary repair work of jails will be undertaken. Apart from this, 240 residential accommodations will be constructed in open jails at a cost of Rs.75 crore.
- 112. To provide seamless and speedy justice to the common man, in the coming year –

Additional District and Sessions Courts will be opened in Bhiwadi-Alwar, Nokha-Bikaner, Sangod-Kota and Taranagar- Churu.

Special Courts (POCSO Act) will be opened in Chittorgarh, Merta and Sikar.

Senior Civil Judge and Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Courts will be opened in Railmagra-Rajsamand and Kishangarh Bas-Alwar.

Additional Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Courts will be opened in Beawar-Ajmer, Rajgarh, Tijara-Alwar, Dausa, Nagaur and Paota-Jaipur.

Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Courts will be opened in Surajgarh-Jhunjhunu and Sedwa (Chhattan)-Barmer.

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Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Courts of Ladnun, Kuchaman City-Nagaur, Srivijayanagar-Sriganganagar, Tibbi-Hanumangarh and Baunli-Sawai Madhopur will be upgraded to **Senior Civil Judge and Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court.**

Family Courts will be opened in Bhilwara, Sri Ganganagar and Udaipur.

I I 3. A building for 'Bar Council of Rajasthan' will be constructed in the premises of Rajasthan High Court, Jodhpur at a cost of Rs.8.53 crore.

GOOD GOVERNANCE

Honourable Speaker, in my first tenure in the year 2002, with the establishment of Lokmitra in Jaipur, we heraleded a new era of seamless services to people without the need to visit government offices. Today Lokmitra in its new avatar as E-Mitra with more than 80 thousand kiosks and about 15 thousand E-Mitra Plus, is providing more than 400 types of online services.

- 114 To provide information about welfare schemes and to provide benefits of government facilities to the eligible family at the door-step, I propose to start 'Mukhya Mantri Digital Seva Yojana'. Under this, I announce to give smart phones with internet connectivity for three years to the 'lady heads' of about 1.33 crore Chiranjeevi families. An annual expenditure of Rs.2,500 crore will be incurred on this. This will not only provide all kinds of services but will also address the facility of quick redressal of grievances.
- 115. In the year 2009-10, I established the first Integrated Government Call Centre of the state. Currently, this 400-seater Call Centre is functioning as 181 CM Helpline. This Toll Free Helpline has played an important role in providing information about various government schemes to the residents, as well as in resolving their problems. Considering this, while further strengthening the 181 CM Helpline, I announce to increase it from 400 to 1000-Seater Call Center. Rs.50 crore will be spent on this.
- 116. Eligibility-based non-cash benefits such as scooty, laptop, bicycle, agricultural equipment, equipment of specially-abled persons, etc. are provided by various departments to the beneficiaries. Beneficiaries will be empowered by providing an option while bringing transparency and

efficiency in this work. For this in the coming year, provision will be made for the beneficiaries to procure the item of their own choice through **'e-RUPI'** and **'Jan Aadhaar e-Wallet'**.

- 117. Block Chain Centre of Excellence will be established at a cost of Rs.30 crore to enhance transparency and security in the use of modern eGovernance technologies: Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) 3.0, Electronic Health Records, Jan Aadhaar Resident Data Repository, etc.
- 118. It is our priority to provide timely services to the reident of the state with accountability and transparency. In view of this, we have developed 'Digital Verification' based Auto Approval and Deemed Approval system, putting an end to the system of mandatory need of documents and physical verification. To make the automated system mandatory for eliminate dependency of eligible beneficiariess on others, I propose for 'Rajasthan Guaranteed Service Delivery and Accountability Act'. This Act will merge and strengthen 'Right to Hearing Act' and 'Guaranteed Delivery of Public Services Act' passed by us earlier.

ADMINISTRATIVE STRENGTHENING

119. For expansion and strengthening of administrative units in the state:

- DPR will be prepared for establishment of Mini Secretariat at Bhiwadi-Alwar, Sikar, Sirohi, Laxmangarh-Sikar, Bhiwadi, Hindoli-Bundi, Sri Ganganagar, Kekri-Ajmer and Banswara.
- II. State Insurance and Provisional Fund Department (SIPF) building will be constructed in Jaipur and Civil Defense Training Institute at Daulatpura (Jamvaramgarh)-Jaipur.
- III. A new building will be constructed in Indira Gandhi Canal Board premises for various Commissions and Statutory Bodies. Rs.50 crore will be spent on this.
- IV. New Sub-Divisional Offices will be opened at Samari-Udaipur, Sawar (Kekdi)-Ajmer, Baswa-Dausa and Mandawa-Jhunjhunu.
- V. Office of Revenue Appellate (Camp Court) court will be opened at Rajgarh-Alwar.

- VI. Khairthal, Harsauli (Kishangarhbas) Alwar, Bhanipura (Sardarshahr) -Churu, Bandikui - Dausa, Pallu (Nohar) - Hanumangarh, Kudi Bhagtasani, Ghantiali (Phalodi) - Jodhpur, Phalsund (Pokaran), Ramgarh
 Jaisalmer, Bhadrajoon (Sanchair) Jalore, Bissau (Mandawa)-Jhunjhunu, Kalwar-Jaipur, Moulasar (Didwana)-Nagaur, Ringas (Khandela)-Sikar Sub Tehsils will be upgraded to Tehsil.
- VII. Sub Tehsils will be opened in Sahdoli (Ramgarh) Alwar, Baraura (Atru)
 Baran, Ranjitpura (Kolait), Sudsar (Dungargarh) Bikaner, Vishala -Barmer, Gopalgarh (Kaman), Kharairi (Bayana), Jaluki (Nagar) -Bharatpur, Abhaneri (Bandikui)-Dausa, Jarga (Basedi), Marina (Rajakheda)-Dholpur, Nimeda (Phagi)-Jaipur, Chamu, Asop (Bhopalgarh)-Jodhpur, Nachana (Pokaran), Mohangarh-Jaisalmer, Guda (Udaipurwati)-Jhunjhunu, Bapawar (Sangod) - Kota, Badu (Parbatsar) - Nagaur, Jaitpur (Rohat), Takhatgarh (Sumerpur) - Pali, Mungana (Dhariyawad) - Pratapgarh, Todra (Khandar) - Sawai Madhopur, Bar (Bhima) - Rajsamand, Ranauli (Peeplu) Tonk and Bawalwara (Khairwara) - Udaipur.
- VIII. In the coming year, 100 new vehicles will be provided to Tehsil offices to replace old ones.
- 120. Bahadurpur (Kishangarhbas), Neemrana, Tapuka-Alwar, Khajuwala-Bikaner, Siwana-Barmer, Mandawar (Mahwa)-Dausa, Naraina (Narayana)-Jaipur, Udaipurwati-Jhunjhunu; Jayal, Basni-Nagaur, Marwar Junction-Pali, Tibbi-Hanumangarh, Dantaramgarh-Sikar and Baunli-Sawai Madhopur will be made Municipalities.

Municipalities in Kotputli-Jaipur and Kuchaman City-Nagaur will be upgraded to Municipal Councils.

- 121. **Sainik Kalyan Bhawan** will be constructed in Jaipur at a cost of Rs.20 crore to provide all facilities to soldiers, ex-servicemen, widows and families of martyr soldiers at one place, and to resolve their grievances.
- 122. The mission of our government is to establish good governance for the common man on the pillars of transparency, accountability and compassion. The concept of good governance is incomplete without the

contribution of employees. Therefore, like in the year 2013, we are taking positive steps to resolve the problems of employees and officers.

- 123. As the honourable House would know, due to the 30 October, 2017 order issued by the previous government to implement the seventh pay scale, an anomaly has arisen regarding ACP (Assured Career Progression), due to which there is still discontent among the employees. To resolve this, I announce to change this order of year 2017, resuming the provision of giving Next Grade Pay payable in the form of ACP as in our previous tenure (year 2013). With this one decision of ours, the government will bear an additional burden of Rs.1000 crore annually from the coming year.
- 124. Employees of many corporations / boards / undertakings / autonomous institutions / universities are currently not getting the benefit of the seventh pay scale. In such organisations also, I announce the grant of seventh pay scale in the coming year. This decision will benefit the employees of all such organisations including Roadways and RTDC.
- 125. To provide adequate opportunities for promotion in various services/cadres, I announce to take necessary steps for reconsitution and increase in promotional posts. This will solve the problem of various services like Rajasthan Animal Husbandry Subordinate Service, Rajasthan Subordinate Office Ministerial Service, Rajasthan Agriculture Subordinate Service, Rajasthan Engineering Subordinate Service, RAC, Police Wireless Service, etc.
- 126. For old age care of personnel who retire after serving for 30-35 years in various government departments, government had been providing them with post-retirement pension.

But under the National Pension Scheme (NPS), for employees recruited in the government after the year 2004, provision has been made only for contributory pension. Such a step would have been taken with a view to reduce the ever-increasing financial burden of pension. But due to the New Pension Scheme, there has already been a sense of great insecurity among employees about managing a living in old age after retirement. This is is a matter of concern for us. We all are aware that government employees can make invaluable contribution towards good governance during the service period only if they feel secured about their future. These employees have shared their concern with me on a number of ocasions. Therefore, I announce to implement Old Pension Scheme (OPS) in the coming year even for all the employees appointed on and after January I, 2004.

- 127. Now, I propose to take the services of Home Guards for logistical tasks in government offices. This will strengthen security and working management of various organisations and create for employment opportunities 10 thousand more home guards.
- 128. Our government has been taking special steps to secure interests of contractual workers. Towards this, **Rajasthan Contractual Hiring to Civil Posts Rules, 2022** have been implemented recently on January 11, 2022. Beside this, contractual employees employed earlier will also be brought under these rules after screening, work for which will be initiated soon.

Also, for the honorarium employees working in various state departments such as Anganwadi workers, Sahayika, Asha Sahyogini, Prerak, Mid Day Meal Cook cum Helper, Langri, Village Employment Assistant, Gram Panchayat Assistant, Shiksha Karmi, Para Teachers, REXCO workers, etc. for whom there is no provision for an anuual increase in honorarium, I also announce to increase their honorarium by 20 percent from I April, 2022.

- 129. Along with the implementation of all government schemes at the grassroots level in the state, elected representatives of urban bodies and panchayat raj institutions have an important role in taking care of well-being of the common man's. In order to make it easier for them to discharge their duties, I announce a 20 per cent hike in their payable honorarium/ allowances from the coming year.
- 130. Everyone will acknowledge the importance of role of the fourth pillar of democracy – the media / press – in ensuring good governance. Like everyone else, our friends in media have not only faced challenges related to Covid, but have also contributed in the fight against it.

In past, I had made a provision of Rs.50 lakh assistance on the death of

accredited journalists on Corona duty.

I now declare to extend the benefit of this Covid assistance to nonaccredited journalists with retrospective effect. At the same time, to enable more journalists to get the benefit of government schemes being run for them, I propose to do widen their coverage by simplifying accredition rules.

131. Honourable Speaker, the steps taken by us to fulfill the promises made in the public manifesto and for timely implementation of budget announcements has increased trust and expectations among the residents as well as public representatives. I have also received a large number of proposals through honourable house for various infrastructure related works including opening administrative and educational institutions. Like in thepast, necessary action will be taken on these proposed works post assessment by the concerned departments.

AGRICULTURE BUDGET

Honorable Speaker,

Now, with your permission, I am presenting the first agriculture budget of the state with the vision of: समृद्ध किसान–खुशहाल राजस्थान

While presenting this budget, I recall these lines of Dr. M S Swaminathan, the founder of Green Revolution:

"If the agriculture goes wrong, nothing else will have a chance to go right in the country."

- 132. Farmer is the pivot of our economy. Even today, as in the entire country, agriculture and other agro-based activities such as horticulture, animal husbandry, dairy, fisheries, etc constitute the primary means of livelihood for about two-thirds of the state's residents. A glance at the state's economy reveals that about 30 per cent of the GSDP comes from agriculture and allied activities; and, more importantly, the livelihood of about 85 lakh families is dependent on agriculture.
- 133. Our government has always been farmer friendly with a mission to

increase sources of income and livelihood for farmers. Our goal is to strengthen the economic condition of our farmers and make Rajasthan one of the leading states of the country in the field of agriculture in the next 5 years.

In the last budget, I had announced 'Mukhyamantri Krishak Saathi Yojna' worth Rs. 2,000 crore under the Krishak Kalyan Kosh. Now, to further strengthen the farmers and giving a major boost to the scheme, I announce to increase the amount of Mukhya Mantri Krishak Saathi Yojana from Rs. 2,000 crore to Rs.5,000 crore. Under this Scheme, work will be undertaken on mission mode to implement the schemes of agriculture and related sectors more effectively. These I I missions are:

- Rajasthan Micro Irrigation Mission
- Rajasthan Organic Farming Mission
- Rajasthan Seed Production and Distribution Mission
- Rajasthan Millets Promotion Mission
- Rajasthan Protected Cultivation Mission
- Rajasthan Horticulture Development Mission
- Rajasthan Crop Protection Mission
- Rajasthan Land Fertility Mission
- Rajasthan Agricultural Labourers Empowerment Mission
- Rajasthan Agri-Tech Mission
- Rajasthan Food Processing Mission

Thus, efforts will be made to ensure all-round development in the field of agriculture on the basis of these Thematic Areas.

Mission-I: Rajasthan Micro Irrigation Mission

'Rajasthan Micro Irrigation Mission' is proposed to be launched at a cost of Rs.2,700 crore in the coming year. More than 5 lakh farmers will be benefitted from this. In the next 3 years under this mission:

Subsidy of Rs. I 705 crore will be given to more than 4 lakh farmers for Drip

/ Sprinkler irrigation facility and of Rs.100 crore to 50,000 farmers for laying down 20,000 kilometers of irrigation pipelines.

Provision will be made for:

- Subsidy to 45,000 farmers for construction of farm ponds at a cost of Rs.375 crore.
- Subsidy to 15,000 farmers for construction of Diggies at a cost of Rs.450 crore.
- Subsidy of Rs.60 crore for onstruction of community resources
- **Center of Excellence for Micro Irrigation** will be established at all the divisional headquarters at a cost of Rs.5 crore each for the provision of research and training related to micro irrigation.

Mission-2: Rajasthan Organic Farming Mission

For better health of community and growing trend of farmers towards natural farming, I had announced **Zero Budget Natural Farming** in the year 2019-20. I now propose to launch "**Mukhyamantri Javik Kheti Mission**" benefitting about **4 lakh farmers** in the next 3 years. A provision of Rs.600 crore is proposed under the mission. This will include:

An additional 3.80 lakh hectares will be brought under organic farming by providing organic seeds, biofertilisers and insecticides to the farmers.

Farmers can get full benefits of organic farming only when their products are certified by an accrediated institution. Fir this, Divisional Level Certification Labs will be established by constitution of **Organic Commodity Board**. A provision of Rs. 15 crore is proposed for this.

Mission-3: Rajasthan Seed Production and Distribution Mission

To increase seed production and to provide free seeds to small and marginal farmers, **'Rajasthan Seed Production and Distribution Mission'** will be launched. Under this mission:

The size of **Beej Swavalamban Yojana** will be doubled benefitting 50,000 farmers in the next two years. For this, 9 lakh quintal seeds will be produced at a cost of Rs.30 crore.

Minikits of certified varieties of seeds of major crops will be provided free of cost to 12 lakh small/ marginal farmers. Rs.78 crore will be spent on this. These seed minikits are:

- Hybrid maize to 8 lakh farmers.
- Moong, moth, urad to 2 lakh farmers
- Mustard seeds to 2 lakh farmers.
- Minikits of green fodder such as jowar, bajra, rijka, berseem and oat seeds to 3 lakh cattle farmers (pashu-paalak).

Rs. 9 crore will be spent on this.

Mission-4: Rajasthan Millets Promotion Mission

In order to encourage the cultivation of millets such as bajra, jowar and coarse grains, etc. in the state and to develop the state as a **Millet Hub**, provision will be made to start **'Rajasthan Millets Promotion Mission'**. Under this, about 15 lakh farmers will be benefited, and Rs.100 crore will be spent on this in the coming year.

Seeds of improved varieties will be provided free of cost to 10 lakh small and marginal farmers at a cost of Rs.25 crore and Micro Nutrients and Bio Pesticide Kit will be provided at subsidised rate to 2 lakh farmers at a cost of Rs.20 crore.

A subsidy of Rs.40 crore will be given for setting up of the first 100 millet processing units.

To provide latest technical know-how and for promotion and conservation of Bajra and other millets, **Centre of Excellence for Millets** will be established under Jodhpur Agricultural University at a cost of Rs.5 crore.

Mission-5: Rajasthan Protected Cultivation Mission

To adopt modern methods and techniques for Protected Cultivation and to encourage the production of non-seasonal crops, **'Rajasthan Protected Farming Mission'** is proposed to be launched. Under this, a subsidy of about Rs.400 crore will be given to 25,000 farmers over next two years for setting up green houses, shade-net houses and low tunnels. In the first phase, 10000 farmers will be benefited in the coming year. In addition, 25 per cent additional subsidy will be given to farmers of the schedule tribal areas.

Mission-6: Rajasthan Horticulture Development Mission

It is proposed to start '**Rajasthan Horticulture Development Mission**' for developing fruit orchards, and expansion of area for production of vegetables, flowers, seed spices and medicinal crops. To benefit 15000 farmers at a cost of Rs.100 crore in the next two years, subsidy will be provided to 10,000 farmers to develop fruit orchards over 15,000 hectares. Also, the subsidy limit will be increased from the present 50% to 75%.

Spice crops will be further expanded in an area of 3,000 hectares and to promote cultivation of medicinal plants, an area of 1500 hectares will be expanded, benefitting 5000 farmers.

Mission-7: Rajasthan Crop Protection Mission

To prevent and control damage caused to crops by Nilgai and stray animals, **'Rajasthan Crop Protection Mission'** will be launched, under which:

A subsidy of Rs. 100 crore will be given in the next two years for 1.25 crore metre of fencing, benefitting more than 35,000 farmers.

In the Tarbandi Scheme, I announce abolishing the condition of considering 3 farmers as one unit, to give benefit to the individual farmer and to increase the minimum area limit to 1.5 hectares.

Mission-8: Rajasthan Land Fertiliy Mission

It is proposed to start '**Rajasthan Land Fertiliy Mission**' to improve the saline and alkaline land and to increase soil fertility with the use of green manure. This will benefit about 2.25 lakh farmers in the next two years. Under this:

22,000 hectares alkaline land will be improved with the use of gypsum at a cost of Rs. I I crore. This will benefit 25,000 farmers.

Minikits of *Dhiacha* seeds will be provided free of cost to 2 lakh farmers for green manure production. Rs. I 4 crore will be spent on this.

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Mission-9: Rajasthan Agricultural Labourers Empowerment Mission

In view of the important role of landless labourers in agricultural work, it is proposed to start **"Rajasthan Agricultural Labourers Empowerment Mission"**. Under this, for Landless Labourers engaged in agricultural works:

In the year 2022-23, I announce a subsidy of Rs.5000 per family to 2 lakh labourers for the purchase of hand-operated agricultural machinery. A provision of Rs.100 crore is proposed for this.

In the next two years, training will be imparted to 1 lakh labourers for skill and capacity building.

Mission-IO: Rajasthan Agri-Tech Mission

To increase the income of farmers by increasing agricultural production, reducing input cost and increasing output in short time, it is necessary to promote farm mechanisation. For this **'Rajasthan Agri-Tech Mission'** is proposed to be started. Under this, with an amount of about Rs.400 crore, over next 2 years:

A subsidy of Rs. 150 crore will be given to 60 thousand farmers on agricultural machinery.

To provide costly machinery & equipment such as tractor, thresher, rotovator, reaper, seed drill, etc. to farmers, I announce to set up 1500 more Custom Hiring Centres through GSS/FPO at a cost of Rs. 150 crore.

In the coming year, 1000 drones will be made available to Farmer Produce Organisations (FPO) and Custom Hiring Centres for effective use of agrichemicals, monitoring, other agricultural related works and locust control. An expenditure of Rs.40 crore will be incurred on this.

IT / Mobile App based Integrated Farmer Support System will be implemented at a cost of Rs.50 crore, giving major boost to Kisan Call Center and Kisan Saathi Portal.

Mission-II: Rajasthan Food Processing Mission

In view of increasing production of agricultural commodities in the state, for its value addition and export promotion, it is proposed to start

'Rajasthan Food Processing Mission'. Under this:

A subsidy of 50% (up to a maximum of Rs. I crore) is proposed to be given to processing units in:

- Pratapgarh, Chittorgarh, Kota, Baran for garlic;
- Barmer and Jalore for pomegranate;
- Jhalawar and Bhilwara for oranges;
- Jaipur for tomato and gooseberry; and
- Alwar, Bharatpur, Dholpur, Karauli, Sawai Madhopur for mustard

50% cost of capital subsidy or a maximum of Rs.2 crore will be provided for the first 10 export-based processing units of **cumin and isabgol** in Jodhpur division.

To encourage beekeeping, 5000 farmers will be benefited by making a provision for subsidy of Rs.50 crore.

In addition, a **Centre of Excellence for Apiculture** will be set up in Bharatpur at a cost of Rs.7.50 crore and a mobile Lab will also be operated for quality testing of honey. Apart from this, honey testing laboratory will be set up in Sriganganagar district.

ELECTRICITY FOR FARMERS

134. To promote the use of solar energy for irrigation in the state, over the next3 years:

I announce 60% subsidy to I lakh farmers for setting up solar pumps. Rs.500 crore will be spent on this.

Along with this, an additional subsidy of up to Rs.45000 will be provided to the farmers of SC and ST category. This will benefit about 50 thousand farmers of SC/ST. An expenditure of Rs.200 crore will be incurred on this.

135. Our government has released 2,48,269 agricultural electricity connections in 3 years, whereas only 2,68,552 electricity connections were released by the previous government during the tenure of 5 years.

In the interest of our farmers and to end more than 9 years of pendency of about 3.38 lakh applications for electricity connection since December 31,

2012, I announce that all outstanding electricity connection applications, till Feb. 22, 2022 will be released in two years. An amount of about Rs.6,700 crore will be spent on this.

136. To rid our farmers of the trouble of irrigating farms at night, I had arranged for the providing electricity during the day in two shifts in 16 districts this year onwards. I realise that farmers have to face a lot of trouble in irrigation at night, especially in winters. Therefore, I announce to provide electricity for irrigation during the day for the remaining 17 districts also, in the next one year.

AGRICULTURE LOAN

- 137. Farmers have been benefited beyond expectations from the Byaj Mukt Fasli Rin Yojana started by us in the year 2012-13. I announce the inclusion of 5 lakh new farmers, setting a target of disbursement of loans amounting to Rs.20000 crore under this scheme in the coming year. For this, Rs.650 crore will be spent on interest subsidy.
- 138. Many families of farmers in rural areas depend on non-farm activities like handicrafts, small scale industries, spinning-weaving, dyeing-printing, etc. for their livelihood along with agriculture and animal husbandry. In the coming year, I announce to disburse interest free loans worth Rs.2000 crore to one lakh families in the non-agriculture sector also. For this, an interest subsidy of about Rs.100 crore will be given.

IRRIGATION DEVELOPMENT

139. Ensuring the availability of water for irrigation in the state, I propose to start the **Rajasthan Irrigation Restructuring Program** for the economic upliftment of farmers. Under this, various works will be undertaken in the next 3 years at a cost of about Rs.14,860 crore. Major works are as follows:

To provide irrigation facility to farmers in 12 districts of the state, about 12000 hectare irrigated area will be developed by starting work on 37 solar energy based, micro irrigation projects worth Rs.550 crore. These projects are:

To stop water wastage and improve efficiency, it is proposed to identify and renovate about 100 dams and 100 canal systems located in different districts at a cost of Rs.800 crore so as to increase the irrigation efficiency.

Construction and renovation work of about 100 water harvesting structures/anicuts is proposed to be undertaken at a cost of Rs.600 crore for groundwater recharge in different districts.

I announce strengthening and renovation of the canal network/ distributaries of Mahi project in Banswara district, at a cost of Rs.545 crore.

Sprinkler irrigation based distribution system of minor irrigation scheme I - IV will be undertaken in Khmera Canal System, in Ghatol-Banswara at a cost of Rs.100 crore.

Strengthening and renovation work for irrigation projects located at Chittorgarh, Pratapgarh, Rajsamand, Bhilwara, Udaipur and Dungarpur districts are proposed to be undertaken at a cost of Rs.200 crore.

Construction of '**Upper High Level Canal**' from Mahi Project was announced by the previous government in the year 2018 to bring more area under irrigation, but work was not started at all. For this tribal area development project, I announce inclusion of 121 additional villages in command area to provide irrigation facility for 41,903 hectares in 338 villages of Banswara, Kushalgarh and Bagidaura at a cost of Rs.2,500 crore.

To provide irrigation facility in the uncommand area of Peepalkhunt tehsil-Pratapgarh from surplus water of Mahi basin, construction of **'Peepalkhunt High Level Canal'** is proposed to be undertaken in two phases. Rs.2,000 crore will be spent on this. With this, additional irrigation facility will be available in an area of 5,000 hectares.

Automation work of 1.20 lakh hectare irrigated area of **Ganganahar** system is proposed for water distribution and regulation in canals and moghas at a cost of Rs.1153 crore.

Work related to the 7th, 8th and 9th minor canals of Bhikha Bhai Sagwara Canal - Banswara, will be undertaken. Along with this, DPR will be prepared for 10th and 11th distribution system.

Maintenance and renovation work of Haridev Joshi Canal Tantra-Banswara will be undertaken at a cost of about Rs. 120 crore.

140. Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP) is an important project for providing drinking and irrigation water in 13 districts of the state: Jhalawar, Baran, Kota, Bundi, Sawai Madhopur, Karauli, Dholpur, Bharatpur, Dausa, Alwar, Jaipur, Ajmer and Tonk. I would like to again remind members of the opposition that Honourable Prime Minister Modi ji in his public meetings at Jaipur and Ajmer on 7th July, 2018 and 6th October, 2018, had promised to declare ERCP as a National Project, but has not done it so far, which is unfortunate. I had also written to the Prime Minister and the Jal Shakti Minister requesting them, and we will continue to request the Central Government in future also. I would like to assure the respected house that considering the importance of ERCP for 13 districts, we are committed to continue the work on this project with our own resources. Under this, works worth Rs.9600 crore are proposed to be taken up for Navnera-Galwa-Bisalpur-Isarda link, Mahalpur barrage and Ramgarh barrage in the coming year.

Also, for time-bound and quality execution of work on the project, I announce the constitution of **East Rajasthan Canal Project Corporation** (ERCP Corporation).

141. I propose renovation and other irrigation related works for Indira GandhiCanal Project at a cost of approximatly Rs.1600 crores. These are as follows:

In Jaisalmer region, where the pucca pits have been damaged, sprinkler irrigation facility will be developed in an area of about one lakh hectares at a cost of Rs.600 crore.

Sprinkler irrigation facility will be developed in the 10,000 hectares of Guru Jambheshwar Lift Canal and in the remaining area of Neta distributory at a cost of Rs.100 crore.

In the lift projects – Sahwa, Gajner, Kolayat – about 400 remaining diggis will be constructed at a cost of Rs.300 crore.

The Kanwarsen lift will be renovated in a phased manner at a cost of Rs.200 crore.

The canals of Charanwala branch will be renovated in a phased manner at a cost of Rs.102 crore benefiting 97000 hectare area of Bikaner and Jaisalmer districts.

All lift projects of IGNP will be renovated and modernised at a cost of Rs.200 crore for proper maintenance and functioning and energy efficiency of old motors/pumps will be enhanced.

Repair and restoration work of Siddhmukh canal will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.

A high-level committee of experts will be formed for technical assessment/survey and viability for converting 30 rain-fed villages of Bhadra, Nohar and Taranagar into canal-irrigated by using irrigation facility from Siddhmukh canal and Sahwa lift canal.

Farmers will be encouraged to adopt micro irrigation for conservation and optimal use of water under **Indira Gandhi Canal Project**. For this, up to 50% subsidy is proposed for use of Drip or Sprinkler irrigation techniques on 10% of total farm area up to a maximum of one hectare. A provision of Rs.100 crore will be made for this.

- 142. To improve efficiency of irrigated areas of Chambal command area Kota, Bundi and Baran – renovation of drainage system, concrete lining works in various canals, distributaries and branch canals are proposed to be undertaken. An expenditure of Rs.483 crore will be incurred on this.
- 143. In the year 2021-22, for the first time in the Punjab region of Rajasthan feeder, relining works were undertaken in a stretch of about 23 km length. Relining was also done in 80 km length of Sirhind feeder. Now, provision will be made for the relining works of 53 km in the Punjab region of Rajasthan feeder and 15 km in Sirhind feeder in the year 2022-23. Rs.425 crore will be spent on this.
- 144. Rs.200 crore will be spent for the repair of Ferozpur feeder (Sriganganagar).

- 145. Renovation work of 68 km long Indira Gandhi Feeder and Main Canal and about 227 km long distributaries/minor canals is proposed to be undertaken for the desert region under the **Rajasthan Water Sector Restructuring Project for Desert Area (RWSRPD)** in the year 2022-23, at a cost of about Rs.600 crore.
- 146. To check recending ground water level by harvesting rain water and using it judiciously, under **Rajiv Gandhi Jal Sanchay Yojana-Phase II**, 2 lakh water harvesting and conservation related works will be undertaken over 20 lakh hectare land in about 4,500 villages of 352 Panchayat Samitis at a cost of Rs.2,600 crore in the next two years.

AGRICULTURAL STORAGE AND MARKETING

The first Home Minister of the country, Iron Man Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel had said:

"My only desire is that India should be a good producer and no one should be hungry, shedding tears for food in the country."

To make Rajasthan a leading agriculture state in the country, it is critical to increase warehousing capacity and strengthen the marketing system besides increasing the quality and productivity.

- 147. In the coming year, Mini Food Parks will be set up in Karawan (Pachpahar)-Jhalawar, Mandal-Bhilwara, Khatoti (Nadbai)-Bharatpur, Kota, Sonwa-Tonk, and in Bundi, Baran, Hanumangarh, Chittorgarh, Ajmer and Udaipur districts at a cost of Rs.220 crore. A Mini Agro Park will be built in Chainpura (Niwai)-Tonk.
- 148. To promote export of state's agricultural products such as isabgol, cumin, coriander and fruits and vegetables, Phyto-sanitary Labs will be set up at Kota and Jodhpur for pesticide residue testing and analysis at a cost of Rs.12 crore. Also, Bio Pesticide and Bio Agents Integrated Lab will be established in Tonk.
- 149. In the next two years, for storage farm produce Cold Storages and Warehouses will be constructed at a cost of Rs.87 crore, including 100 MT capacity warehouses and offices in 100 Gram Seva Cooperative Samitis

currently devoid of warehouses. A subsidy of Rs.44 crore will be provided to 5000 farmers for construction of low-cost onion storage structures.

- 150. Infrastructure facilities will be developed in premises of Gaun (Secondary) mandi at Chandan-Jaisalmer, Lohawat, Aau, Dechun-Jodhpur, Poogal-Bikaner, Hindoli-Bundi, Samrania, Nahargarh-Baran, Rawatbhata-Chittorgarh and Tunga-Jaipur at a cost of Rs. 100 crore.
- 151. Gaun (Secondary) Mandi in Bikampur (Kolait)-Bikaner, Chamun (Shergarh)-Jodhpur, Mandrayal (Sapotra)- Karauli, Anar Mandi in Gaun (Secondary) Mandi, Sayla-Jalore, and Agriculture Mandi in Bhopalgarh-Jodhpur and Reodar-Sirohi will be established.

Also, it is proposed to declare Bilara-Jodhpur Krishi Mandi as A Commodity-specific Mandi for Fennel.

INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING

152. Gram Sahkari Samitis (GSS) have an important role in providing agricultural input (seeds, fertilizers and pesticides etc.) and mini bank facilities to farmers. Currently, about 67 lakh member farmers are getting benefits through 7133 GSS constituted in the state. I announce to set up GSS at remaining 4171 gram panchayat headquarters in the next two years.

Along with this, to facilitate small farmers from every corner of the state to join cooperative institutions, the contribution fixed for village cooperative society will be reduced from Rs.5 lakh to Rs.3 lakh and the minimum number of members required will be reduced from 500 to 300.

- 153. Various initiatives will be taken up for training and capacity building development along with research in agriculture sector. These are as follows:
 - Agriculture Colleges will be opened in Mundawar-Alwar, Kekri-Ajmer, Barmer, Pokaran-Jaisalmer, Nohar, Jogiwala (Bhadra)-Hanumangarh, Didwana, Nawan-Nagaur, Keswana (Sayla)-Jalore, Mandawa, Chirawa-Jhunjhunu, Osian- Jodhpur, Pahari (Kaman) Bharatpur, Khedlabuzurg (Mahva)-Dausa, Karauli, Todabhim-Karauli, Pratapgarh

and Khairwara-Udaipur.

- II. Krishi Vigyan Kendra will be opened at Deoli (Uniyara)-Tonk.
- III. Animal Husbandry Training Institute will be opened at Nathdwara-Rajsamand.

DAIRY AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

- 154. For connecting more villages with dairy cooperatives, creating employment opportunities, increasing income of livestock farmers and providing high quality milk and milk products to the consumers, in the coming year:
 - Registration of 2500 new milk producer cooperative societies will be undertaken.
 - 51 new milk routes will be started connecting more than 500 villages.
 - 5000 new dairy booths will be opened, out of which 1000 dairy booths will be allotted to women and women self-help groups.
 - Milk Processing Plant will be set up in Rajsamand district at a cost of Rs.30 crore.
 - Processing Plant of Jaisalmer District Milk Federation will be strengthened at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.
- 155. 'Camel Protection and Development Policy' is proposed to be implemented for rearing, protection and overall development of the state animal. Under this, a provision of Rs. 10 crore will be made for the coming year.
- 156. We have made a provision of providing Rs. 1.57 crore per Nandi Shala at the block level for the villagers/ farmers for resolving the problem of stray animals. At the time of pre-budget meetings, farmers had requested for increase of their coverage. I would like to call upon voluntary organisations to come forward for this important and noble cause. In the coming year, in the Gram Panchayats where competent NGOs are available to run a cowshed/animal shelter, gaushalas will be set up on priority at a cost of up to Rs. I crore each. In this way, we wish to establish animal shelters at all Gram Panchayats in a phased manner.

- 157. For the expansion of veterinary facilities in the state and to provide better veterinary medicine:
 - A College of Veterinary Science will be opened in Malsisar (Mandawa)-Jhunjhunu.
 - II. Government Veterinary Hospitals at Chaksu-Jaipur and Kuchaman City-Nagore will be upgraded to Multipurpose Veterinary Hospitals.
 - III. Veterinary Hospitals of Nagola (Bhinay)-Ajmer, Dulchasar (Dungargarh)-Bikaner, Bhanpur Kalan (Jamwaramgarh)-Jaipur, Khudiala (Shergarh), Panditji Ki Dhani (Osian)-Jodhpur, Jawla (Parbatsar), Roll (Jayal), Tausina (Didwana) Maharajpura (Nawan)-Nagaur and Bagri Nagar (Sojat), Khairwa (Sumerpur), Jojawar (Marwar Junction)-Pali will be upgraded to First Grade Hospitals.
 - IV. Veterinary Sub-Centres at Jhalatala (Laxmangarh)-Alwar, Novi (Sumerpur), Jaitpur (Rohat)-Pali, Kaitri (Saipau)-Dholpur, Neemla-Jaipur, Kayamsar (Fatehpur)-Sikar and Rasla (Fatehgarh)-Jaisalmer will be promoted to Veterinary Hospitals.
 - V. New Veterinary Sub Centres will be opened at- Pagara (Pisangan)-Ajmer, Jagpura (Badnore)-Bhilwara, Bishanpura-Dausa, Sujangarh-Churu, Avalhera, Gopalpura (Bengu)-Chittaurgarh, Koliwada (Jamwaramgarh)-Jaipur, Chenda, Khimada, Bamnera (Sumerpur)-Pali, Bahala (Pokaran), Kolutla-Jaisalmer, Al Baks ka Bagh (Laxmangarh)-Alwar, Garinda (Fatehpur)-Sikar and Devikheda (Deoli), Chandwad (Duni)-Tonk.
 - VI. **Block Veterinary Health Office (BVHO)** and Primary Disease Diagnosis Labs will be established in the First Grade Veterinary Hospitals functional at the Panchyat Samiti level.
 - VII. Along with this, repair and upgradation works will be undertaken in 3000 veterinary institutions of the state at a cost of Rs. 15 crore.
- 158. It is proposed to benefit about 6 lakh cattle farmers (pashu-paalak) by providing the benefit of animal insurance in the coming year. Rs. 150 crore will be spent for this in the year 2022-23.

- 159. To ensure quality animal feed, a **Regulatory Authority** will be constituted by bringing in a necessary Act. Also, testing labs will be set up in each district to check the quality of animal feed.
- 160. To encourage milk producers, **Mukhyamantri Dudh Utpadak Sambal Yojana** was started on April 1, 2013 for giving a subsidy on milk of Rs.2 per litre. This was probably country's first initiative. It was discontinued by the previous government, which created a sense of despair among cattle farmers (pashu-paalak). As you are aware, as soon as our government was formed, I had resumed this scheme from 1st February, 2019. I now announce to increase the subsidy amount payable on milk from Rs.2 per litre to Rs.5 per litre under this Scheme in the coming year. With this, about 5 lakh milk producers will receive an amount of Rs.550 crore.
- 161. Through this Agriculture Budget, it is our endeavour to open new avenues of development in agriculture and allied sectors and to strengthen our farmers.
- 162. Honourable Speaker, I present this budget for the year 2022-23 before the honourable house for:

Prosperity in the fields of our farmers,

Empowering the dreams of daughters and women,

Better education of children in school,

Good health of residents of the state,

Fulfilling the aspirations of youth,

Bringing happiness to homes of the poor/middle class,

Transforming the villages,

Changing the pace of cities,

Advance science and research,

Empowerment and progress of everyone.

163. In this budget presented by our government, we have made an effort to prepare future plans keeping in mind the expectations of people from every section, caste and religion. I would like to assure the House that we are committed to implemention of these welfare schemes and for happiness and prosperity of every resident of the state.

TAX PROPOSAL

- 164. Honourable Speaker, with your permission, I now present the tax proposal before the House.
- 165. While presenting the last budget, in view of the situation arising out of Covid, I had given a relief of approx. Rs.900 crores while deciding not to impose any new tax. Also, at the time of Covid, after January 2021, by reducing the rates of VAT on petrol and diesel by Rs.6 and Rs.7 per liter respectively, we have given relief against inflation to people of the state. Due to this, there will be an additional burden of Rs.6000 crore annually on revenue of the state. Although there has been some improvement in the economy of the country and the state, it cannot be assumed that the economy is fully back on track.

To improve the economy of the state, in this budget, an effort has been made to provide relief to all sections of the society.

166. Rajasthan holds a unique distinction in the country and abroad for its culture, hospitality and tourism. Besides being important from the point of state's economy tourism is also a leading provider of employement opportunities. The most adverse effect of Covid has been on the tourism sector.

For years, there has been a demand from the tourism sector to give it industry status. Many announcements have been made since year 1989, but the actual industry status has not been accorded. I am glad that this day will be a day to remember in the field of tourism. Now to provide support to this sector, I anounce to give full recognition to **Tourism and Hospitality Sector as "Industry Sector"**. With this, in future, Government tariffs and levies will be payable for this sector as per the industrial norms. This will put an additional burden of about Rs.700 crore on the State Government every year.

167. Simultaneously, to provide assistance to other industries and sectors of business in recovering from the Covid crisis:

- For units taking benefits of RIPS-2010 and RIPS-2014, whose benefit period ends on 31 March, 2022, I announce to extend the benefit period by one year.
- (ii) Under the Rajasthan MSME (Facilitation of Establishment and Operation) Act-2019, to provide support to MSME entrepreneurs, I announce to exempt enterprises from approvals and inspections for 5 years instead of 3 years.
- (iii) To encourage industries in the state, I announce complete exemption in land conversion fee of private agricultural land for white category micro, small, medium and large scale industries/enterprises in rural areas.
- (iv) Hotel and Tour Operators were reimbursed the deposited SGST from time to time. I now announce to reimburse 50% of SGST deposited during the period of January, 2022 to March, 2022.
- (v) Service Charge is increased by 10% every year by RIICO in its industrial areas. To give relief to industries, this increase will not be implemented in the year 2022-23.
- (vi) Keeping in view the third wave of covid pandemic, I announce the reduction of the default increase of 10% in DLC rates to just 5% for the year 2022-23.
- (vii) I announce an increase of existing limit of 40% of built up area to 60% for sub-let of the constructed building on government allotted land by the media organisations.
- 168. Honourable Speaker, Today, emphasing the important contribution of our farmers, we have presented the first agriculture budget of the state.

On this occasion, I recall the statement of former USA President, Thomas Jefferson:

"If the farmer is rich, then so is the Nation."

- 169. With these sentiments, to encourage agriculture and agro-based industry:
 - For the establishment/expansion of agriculture based MSME units, it is proposed to increase Interest Subsidy from 8% to 9% under the

"Mukhyamantri Laghu Udhyog Protsahan Yojana".

- (ii) The "Interest Waiver Scheme-2019" of Mandi Fee/Allotment Fee etc. has been successful. I now propose to extend the duration of this Scheme till 30 September, 2022.
- (iii) Likewise, it is proposed to extend the period for depositing the outstanding amount till 30 September, 2022 under the "Mandi Shulk Maafi Yojana" on Agricultural Commodities and Sugar Imported from outside the State for agricultural processing.
- (iv) I announce to allot land in Mandi premises at the reserved price for the pending applications prior to the year 2010.
- (v) I announce to extend the period of construction on the allotted plots in Mandi premises without penalty till 30th September, 2022.
- (vi) Provision will be made for free allocation of government land for new Mandis and Mini Food Parks announced in budgets for the years 2020-21, 2021-22 as well as in this budget.
- (vii) The exemption in Krishak Kalyan Shulk payable till 31 March, 2022 is proposed to be extended for a period of one year.
- (viii)Instead of charging mandi fee or Krishak Kalyan Shulk on non-notified agricultural commodities and food items, it is proposed to provide trading facility in the mandi by taking 0.50% user charges.
- 170. In the last budget, given Covid circumstances, Amnesty Scheme was announced, giving relaxation to entrepreneurs and for residents on recovery of outstanding amount under VAT, Stamps, Excise, Motor Vehicle and such Acts of the state. This was welcomed by all sections. In the coming year, more relaxation is proposed to be given through new amnesty schemes:
 - VAT Amnesty: Last year, I provided relief to more than 2 lakh dealers by announcing Amnesty Scheme-2021 related to Repealed Acts-Sales Tax, VAT, Entry Tax. etc., which also generated revenue of about Rs.500 crore. I now announce of Amnesty Scheme-2022, in which:
 - a. Provision will be made to re-open assessment orders by passing
ex-parte or best judgment for the settlement of the demand amount before 30 June, 2017.

- b. It is proposed to do away with the issue related to prescribed time period for making Suo-Moto rectification in the orders passed earlier.
- c. For such dealers who do not have any known movable and immovable assets, the process of writing off the demand amount will be simplified. For this, it is proposed to re-determine the pecuniary limit of officers.
- d. A specific procedure will be developed to eliminate the demands created in the context of such firms by whom no goods have been purchased and sold.
- e. The deadline for submission of outstanding declaration forms will be extended till June 30, 2022.
- f. Input tax verification will be simplified.
- g. I declare to forgo the ongoing demands against departments, corporations-undertakings, etc. of State Government along with the demands generated against various units of the Defense Department of Government of India.
- h. It is proposed to give incentive to the concerned officers/employees under this Scheme to encourage recovery.

After the implementation of GST, only 6 types of goods are currently taxable under the VAT Act. A separate Amnesty Scheme-2022 is also proposed to be introduced for settlement of the outstanding ongoing demands in respect of these goods.

II. Stamp Duty: I announce the implementation of Stamp Duty Amnesty Scheme-2022 from the coming year, for a period till 30 September, 2022. In this Scheme, along with 100% exemption in interest and penalty, it is proposed to give 50% exemption on outstanding stamp duty.

Along with this, it is proposed to provide complete exemption of

interest and penalty to the parties in the form of a Permanent Amnesty on depositing the outstanding stamp duty on any document in audit or inspection within a period of one month from the date of first demand notice.

- III. Motor Vehicle Act: In order to provide relief to vehicle owners, I propose to introduce Transport Amnesty Scheme-2022. The duration of this Scheme will be till 30 September, 2022, in which:
 - a. Amnesty Scheme will be brought for compounding of offenses committed by 31 December, 2021 in respect of overloaded vehicles on e-Ravanna portal of the Mines Department.
 - b. On payment of outstanding motor vehicle tax of up to 31
 December, 2021, interest and penalty on will be waived.
 - c. On deposit of the outstanding amount, the tax, interest and penalty payable after the date of destruction of the destroyed vehicles will be waived.
- IV. Excise: Excise Amnesty Scheme-2022 is proposed to be announced in the coming year to provide exemption to more dealers. This Scheme will be valid till 30 September 2022.
 - a. 100% rebate in interest will be given in all outstanding cases till 31
 March, 2021; and
 - b. In all cases outstanding up to 31 March, 2014, category-wise partial exemption in principal amount is also proposed to be given.
- V. RIICO: Amnesty Scheme-2022 will be announced for industries established in RIICO areas which will be effective till 30th September, 2022. Under this Scheme:
 - a) 100% rebate in interest on lump-sum deposition of Service Charge and Economic Rent;
 - b) 75% rebate in Retention Charge / additional land cost payable on regularisation of delay in starting construction on allotted plot;
 - c) 50% rebate will be given in the fee payable on transfer of plot/subdivided plot;

- d) It is proposed to give 100% rebate in penalty/interest on lumpsum deposition of outstanding water charges and outstanding CETP charges;
- e) The prescribed time limit for construction of rain water recharge structure on the industrial plot will be extended without penalty; and
- f) It is proposed to give 50% rebate in the payable interest amount on deposition of outstanding installments of land premium up to June 30, 2021.
- VI. Colonisation Area: In the period from 1 April, 2022 to 31 December, 2022, on outstanding installments of agricultural land allotment to about 15000 tenants of colonisation area:
 - a. 100% rebate in interest is proposed to be given on lump-sum deposition of the remaining installments till 31 December, 2022; and
 - b. On depositing all outstanding installments of allotment in lumpsum, it is proposed to give 100% rebate in interest along with 10% rebate in principal amount.
- VII Mining related: Relief will be given to mining lease holders, quarry license holders and royalty contractors through amnesty scheme for about 1800 outstanding cases till 31 March, 2021. Along with this, for the first time, cases of illegal mining, transportation and issuance are also proposed to be included in this Scheme.
- VIII Vigilance Check Report (VCR): Currently, in view of the outstanding amount of crores of rupees in large number of pending Vigilance Check Report (VCR) of power distribution companies, it is proposed to announce an Amnesty Scheme for their final disposal. In this:
 - a. For disposal of pending Vigilance Check Reports on or before 31 December, 2021, if there is a civil liability amount up to Rs. I lakh, the final settlement will be done by taking 50% of this amount and of the entire compounding amount.

- b. If the civil liability amount is more than Rs.1 lakh, then the final settlement will be done by taking 50% of the amount up to Rs.1 lakh and 10% of the amount above Rs.1 lakh along with the entire compounding amount.
- c. This amount can be deposited in six monthly installments without any interest. Under this Scheme, applications can be submitted from I April, 2022 to 30 September, 2022.
- 171. The units that have availed benefits as per Entitlement Certificate by taking customised package in RIPS-2003, RIPS-2010 and RIPS-2014, if such units have started or will start commercial production during the operational period of RIPS-2019, I announce to give them the benefit of RIPS-2019 on the condition of investment of Rs.400 crore and providing employment to 200 people.
- 172. The units that do not have SGST liability are unable to get the benefit of investment subsidy. Provision of capital grant is proposed for such units as an alternative to SGST reimbursement in RIPS-2019.
- 173. New research for environment protection at the global level in the bio and green sector has led to emergence of some Sunrise Sectors. I announce to give additional benefits by adding these to Thrust Sectors under RIPS-2019:
 - Chemical and Petrochemicals in the proposed 800-hectare PCPIR (Petroleum, Chemicals and Petrochemicals Investment Region) area of Refinery and Petrochemicals Complex established at Pachpadra, Barmer district, Rajasthan;
 - Electronics;
 - Medical Devices;
 - Bulk Drugs;
 - Manufacturing related to Rare Earth Elements; and
 - Green Hydrogen
- 174. Units in Inland Container Depot (ICD) with minimum investment of Rs.50 crore and land area of 10 acres are proposed to be given benefits by

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including them in service sector activities and Thrust Sector of RIPS-2019.

- 175. Under RIPS-2019, I announce to increase the maximum limit of Capital Subsidy payable to enterprises investing in the manufacturing sector of Thrust Sector - Gems & Jewelery from Rs.25 lakh to Rs. I crore.
- 176. Four players of the state Avani Lakhera, Devendra Jhajharia, Sunder Singh and Krishna Nagar – have brought laurels to the state by winning 5 medals in Tokyo Para Olympics. There is a need to encourage the private sector to contribute in setting up of infrastructure for preparing national and international level players.

With this view, I announce to include Sports Academy to be set up in private sector in eligible service area under RIPS-2019 and to give Capital Subsidy up to Rs. I crore on purchase of equipment. Along with this, the maximum limit of capital subsidy to be given in sports goods sector is proposed to be increased from Rs.25 lakh to Rs. I crore under RIPS-2019.

- 177. To strengthen the economy of the state and to provide more employment opportunities, we are making constant efforts to bring new investments into the state. I am glad to inform the honourable house that to implement MoUs/LoIs under Invest Rajasthan-2022, all formalities being completed and laying of foundation stone and other related work is also being undertaken. So far:
 - (i) A total of 4016 MoUs (Memorandum of Understanding) and Lol (Letter of Intent) worth Rs.10.41 lakh crore have been signed. These are likely to generate employment for about 4.90 lakh persons.
 - (ii) In the field of renewable energy, 92 MoUs/LoIs worth Rs.7.98 lakh crore have been signed. These are likely to create 2.20 lakh jobs.
- 178. In view to increase the investment in the state progressively, making RIPS-2019 more comprehensive, I now announce the introduction of **Rajasthan Investment Promotion Scheme-2022 (RIPS-2022)**. To establish Rajasthan as a Competitive Destination as compared to different states, it is proposed to make investment friendly provision in RIPS-2022 which are as follows -
 - (I) Provision of Capital Subsidy will be made as an alternative to re-

imbursement of SGST payable at present;

- (ii) For the first time in the state, we have made a provision of Production Linked Incentive in the Ethanol Policy. This will be extended to other selected sectors as well;
- (iii) After inception of new RIPS, the units that are currently getting benefits of erstwhile RIPS, they do not get the benefit or option of provisions of the new RIPS for the remaining period. Tenure Based Incentives System will be implemented for such units, for the selected sectors / customised package;
- (iv) Auto Disbursal system is proposed to be implemented with a view to give the benefits payable under RIPS in a time bound manner, ridding the investors of the problem of repeated visits to various departments;
- (v) Keeping the limit of 100% exemption of Stamp Duty unchanged, 75% Stamp Duty exemption will be given in the beginning and balance 25% Stamp Duty deposited by the eligible industrial unit will be re-imbursed on the start of commercial production.
- 179. The Mukhya Mantri Laghu Udhyog Protsahan Yojana announced by us to increase investment in MSME sector is a unique scheme in the entire country. The scheme has been received with a lot of enthusiasm by small entrepreneurs interested in setting up industries. But the problem of pending cases under this Scheme has been brought to my notice.

To solve this, it is proposed to give benefit of the Scheme by giving onetime exemption to cases sanctioned from banks and those reported in the District Industries Centres before the amendment issued on 27 August, 2021. With this, about 1000 units that had got loan but were not able to fulfill the eligibility due to the amended provisions, will now be able to get the benefits of the Scheme.

To give maximum incentive to small investors taking loans up to Rs.10 lakh, other provisions of the Scheme such as maintaining the ratio between term loan and working capital and submission of application within 90 days after disbursement of loan from financial institution, and

other conditions will be abolished, strengthening MSMEs.

In this way, a provision of Rs. I 50 crore is proposed for Interest Subsidy in the coming year to give major boost to Mukhya Mantri Laghu Udhyog Protsahan Yojana.

- 180. As you are aware, today I have announced to give industry status to Tourism. In this sequence to encourage tourism in rural areas of the state,
 Rajasthan Rural Tourism Scheme is proposed to be announced, under which eligible units will be provided the following benefits:
 - (i) 100% exemption in stamp duty will be given. Initially 25% stamp duty will be payable and will be re-imbursed on submission of certificate of commencement of tourism unit;
 - (ii) 100% of payable and deposited SGST will be reimbursed for 10 years; and
 - (iii) Under the Mukhya Mantri Laghu Udhyog Protsahan Yojana, 9% interest subsidy will be given instead of 8% on loans up to Rs.25 lakh.
- 181. In order to promote investment in the state, it is proposed to reduce the maximum limit of stamp duty from Rs.25 lakh to Rs.15 lakh on documents executed by industries for provision of loans from banks and financial institutions and on documents of debt assignment.
- 182. Along with holistic industrial development in the state, our government is committed to ensuring participation of the deprived sections. Currently, representation of Dalits, Tribals and people of low income group in the industrial sector is negligible; this is a challenge for us. We want that people from deprived classes like Dalit, Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Classes, Extremely Backward Classes, Minorities and even from economically weaker sections can make economic progress by setting up industries.

For this, in the last budget, I had given additional benefits under RIPS-2019 under "Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar SC/ST Entrepreneur Incentive Special Package". Due to Corona, this section was unable to take full advantage of the Package. Therefore, taking this forward, I announce "Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar Rajasthan Dalit, Adivasi Enterprises Promotion Scheme-2022". Under this 9 types of relief will be given:

- Incubation cum Training Centre will be set up at a cost of Rs.100 crore to enable the deprived sections to set up their own enterprises. This Centre will be operated in collaboration with Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) / Dalit Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DICCI).
- (ii) Also, provision will be made for 10% participation of RIICO/Rajasthan Venture Capital Fund (RVCF) in selected industries being set up under this scheme, up to a maximum of Rs.25 lakh per unit. This innovative initiative will help building investment capacity of this section. This type of partnership will help them in getting technical and various other approvals;
- (iii) Provision will be made to increase the prescribed land size from 2000 sqm to 4000 sqm and reservation in allotment from 5% to 6% in RIICO industrial areas.
- (iv) Full rebate will be given in interest on installments of allotted land;
- (v) 75% concession will be given in Land Conversion Fee;
- (vi) 100% exemption in Stamp Duty on land purchase, lease and loan documents; of which 75% stamp duty exemption will be given initially, and 25% stamp duty deposited by eligible industrial unit will be re-imbursed on commencement of commercial production;
- (vii) Under the Mukhya Mantri Laghu Udhyog Protsahan Yojana, 1% additional Interest Subsidy will be given;
- (viii) 25% Margin Money and subsidy up to Rs.25 lakh will be given; and
- (ix) 100% SGST re-imbursement will be done for 7 years.
- 183. Honourable Speaker, Even in the midst of economic challenges, our government has taken care for all sections.

As America's eminent physician and philosopher Oliver Wendell Holmes, Sr. said:

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"Put not your trust in money, but put your money in trust."

On this occasion, I assure the honorable house that with our proficient financial management, we will continue the effort of simplification of taxation process and providing relief to various sectors.

- 184. It is proposed to rationalise the maximum limit of stamp duty on Merger and Demerger documents of companies to reduce it from Rs.200 crore to Rs.50 crore.
- 185. In view of the similarity in nature of Limited Liability Partnership (LLP) and Partnership Firms, stamp duty on documents relating to constitution, dissolution (winding up) of the LLP and retirement of the partners is proposed to be at par with that of the documents executed in the case of Partnership Firms.
- 186. To encourage business in the state, Stamp Duty on documents is proposed to be reduced from 6% to 0.5% and registration fee to a maximum of Rs.10000 on conversion of commercial units from one commercial structure (Partnership Firm, Proprietorship Firm etc.) to another commercial structure according to their business needs.
- 187. Currently, 100-year old properties are considered as heritage for the purpose of concession in stamp duty. Now, hotels running in buildings built before January 1, 1950 will be treated as 'Heritage Hotels' with a provision of concession in stamp duty as per the Rajasthan Tourism Policy, 2015.
- 188. To promote tourism in the state, valuation of land for a resort, sports resort, health resort, camping site, amusement park, animal safari park, etc. will be at agricultural rates instead of commercial rates. Also, valuation of land for Convention Center/Community Building purpose will be at par with residential rates in cities and agricultural rates in rural areas.
- 189. To eliminate unnecessary litigation related to valuation of properties sold through public auction, provision will be made for valuation of such properties on the auction amount and for valuation of properties allotted by the government and state undertakings on allotment price.

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- 190. DLC rates of lands for warehouse purpose are proposed to be reduced from commercial to industrial rates and DLC rates for lands of agro-based industries to be reduced from twice to one and a half times that of agricultural lands.
- 191. Currently, allotment of lands for warehouse purpose in RIICO areas is done at one and a half times the industrial rates. I announce to reduce it at par with industrial rates.
- 192. Real estate is the largest employment generating industry. To encourage this industry by reducing the cost of large area projects, it is proposed to give concession in valuation of residential and commercial plots (DLC) as follows:
 - (I) From 1000 sqm to 2000 sqm: 5%;
 - (ii) More than 2000 sqm but up to 3000 sqm: 10%;
 - (iii) Over 3000 sqm: 15%
- 193. In the last budget, 2% exemption in stamp duty was given on purchase of flats up to Rs.50 lakh in multi-storey buildings. On popular demand, I announce to extend this exemption by one year till 31 March, 2023.
- 194. Concession in stamp duty has already been provided on resale of residential units in multi-storey buildings. On the same lines, in case of remaining properties also, after the first sale, if sold again within 1 year, 2 years or 3 years, then on subsequent sale deed rebate of equal to 15%, 10% and 5% respectively of the stamp duty paid at the first time of the sale is proposed to be given.
- 195. To give relief to residents, it is proposed to amend Section 5 of the Limitation Act the Rajasthan Stamp Act to provide facility to accept revision even after the lapse of prescribed time limit for revision.
- 196. In view of the suggestions given by businessmen from mining sector during pre-budget discussion in the Tax Advisory Committee, mining leases/ quarry licenses of minor minerals expiring till 31 March, 2025 will be extended till March 31, 2040, subject to the condition of payment of fixed premium.

- 197. In view to promote scientific and safe mining, I announce to remove the maximum limit of 4 hectares for issuing mining lease for Minor Minerals in agricultural land partnership.
- 198. It is proposed to allot mining lease/licensee up to a defined area out of the land available near the mining leases/quarry license of Minor Minerals on payment of prescribed premium.
- 199. I am proposing for lease agreement execution for mining lease contract execution without environment permission, but mining work will be allowed only after obtaining environment clearance.
- 200. For transfer of mining leases of minor minerals, it is proposed to charge 5 times premium of dead rent/license fee upto maximum premium of Rs.5 lakh instead of 10 times premium and maximum of Rs.10 lakh.
- 201. I propose to make arrangement for quarterly returns in place of monthly online returns by the lessees with respect to mining leases of minor minerals.
- 202. For pollution control, there is a 50% exemption in motor vehicle tax for CNG run vehicles. Now this discount will also be applicable on vehicles with CNG kit retrofitment.
- 203. Last year, by making provision for issue of Contract Carriage Permit for Divisional area 50% exemption was provided in Motor Vehicle Tax as compared to All Rajasthan Permit. It is proposed to increase this exemption to 70%.
- 204. For stage carriage buses, it is proposed to provide 25% rebate in Motor Vehicle Tax payable in March, the last month of the financial year, on regular payment of Motor Vehicle Tax from April to February.
- 205. Currently, maximum period of R.C Surrender in a calendar year is 90 days, which is proposed to be increased to 180 days.
- 206. To facilitate functioning of industries, a Policy will be drafted for reinstating plots cancelled due to various reasons in RIICO areas and rationaling the fee charged in future.
- 207. Allotment of land in RIICO areas is done through e-auction. It is proposed

to make provision for direct allocation also to certain categories of industries such as Anchor Investors under Sunrise Sectors, investors eligible for customised package under RIPS and small local investors, etc., by marking special zones.

208. Last year, keeping in view the inconvenience being faced by small taxpayers, the mandatory limit of e-way bill for transportation of goods in the state was increased from Rs.50,000 to Rs. I lakh.

I now propose to abolish the mandatory requirement of **e-way bill** on intra-city transportation of goods – baring certain items – to facilitate the taxpayers to do business up to the limit of Rs.2 lakh.

- 209. Lottery is banned by most of the states but there is still a network of online games. Today the trend of online games is increasing among youth and children. Online betting is banned by the court, but there is no ban on Online Skill Based Games. Right now, many online games are functioning without any control and scrutiny. It is necessary to control and regulate them. Under such conditions, it is proposed to bring an Act to control online skill based games/fantasy games.
- 210. In the year 2021-22, provision of Rs.5 crore was made for Late Shri Gurusharan Chhabra Public Awareness Campaign for temperance on moral, religious and health grounds. This work of bringing public awareness will be successful only when social organisations, NGOs and civil society work together with the government. For this, I would like to call upon all social organisations aligned to this thinking to come forward and join the government efforts. I announce to increase this amount to Rs.10 crore for the coming year.
- 211. It is proposed to upgrade the infrastructure and human resources for the strengthening of various revenue earning departments. For this:
 - While decentralising the system of registration of documents, model sub-registrar offices will be opened at Jaipur, Jodhpur, and Bhiwadi with private sector participation on the lines of passport offices;
 - (ii) To facilitate parties and the common man in full-time sub-registrar offices, an amount of Rs.10 lakh will be allotted per office and

construction and renovation work of office building of 11 Deputy Registrars and 2 Deputy Inspector Generals will be undertaken;

- (iii) To provide taxpayers of the state facilitation service at the commercial tax headquarters, I propose to set up a Tax Facilitation and Support Centre at a cost of Rs. 100 crore
- (iv) Rajasthan Commercial Tax Service and Rajasthan Commercial Tax Subordinate Service posts are proposed to be reconstituted;
- (v) More than 400 vacancies of constables will be filled in Excise Police stations; it is proposed to strengthen and modernise Rajasthan State Breweries Corporation Limited and Rajasthan Ganganagar Sugar Mills Limited at a cost of Rs.25 crore; and
- (vi) In view of the volume of work related to Transport Department, it is proposed to open an additional Regional Transport Office at Jaipur Headquarter. 50 vehicles will be provided to the Department for enforcement activities and increasing efficiency.
- 212. Honourable House would remember that while presenting the last budget, our government had taken an innovative initiative in form of SSIPS (Social Security Investment Promotion Scheme), to encourage institutions working for the upliftment of socially and economically needy sections. Taking this forward, to provide social support, concessions will be provided in the coming year as per the following:
 - (i) I propose provision to be made in rules regarding transfer of ownership of Nazul properties in the State by residential occupiers of Low-Income Group residing from before the year 2000, on lump sum deposition of 25% of the prevailing DLC or reserve price, whichever is less.
 - (ii) In the event of sale of agricultural land and residential accomodations constructed on them, stamp duty and registration fee is charged by adding current value of wells and tube wells. I announce to grant complete exemption in stamp duty and registration fee payable on valuation of such wells and tube wells;

- (iii) To provide relief to specially abled, it is proposed to give exemption on vehicles purchased by them; under this:
 - a. Specially abled with locomotor disability will be granted 100% exemption in Motor Vehicle Tax on purchase of four wheelers of up to Rs.10 lakh with automatic transmission; and
 - b. Full exemption in Motor Vehicle Tax will be provided on the purchase of adapted / retrofitted two wheelers / three wheelers used for Specially abled
- (IV) To fulfill the dream of one's own house for middle and low income group, I announce to give 1% exemption in Stamp Duty on vacant or constructed residential plots up to 100 square yards;
- (V) Along with this, it is proposed to give one percent exemption in stamp duty on vacant or constructed commercial plots up to 50 square yards for the general public to set up their own business;
- (VI) Currently, in case of abdication of ancestral property, Stamp Duty is Rs.500 for property upto Rs.10 lakh and Rs.5000 for property valued more than Rs.10 lakh. I now announce to reduce the Stamp Duty on ancestral property valued above Rs.10 lakh also to Rs.500.
- (VII) In the last budget, I reduced the Stamp Duty on gift deed executed in favor of daughter-in-law from 2.5% to 1% – as for daughters – with maximum Rs.I lakh, and also Stamp Duty was completely waived on gift deed in favour of grandson-granddaughter, children of both son and daughter. I now declare gift deed documents in favour of daughter and daughter-in-law completely free from Stamp Duty;
- (VIII) Similarly, at the beginning of our Government's tenure in March, 2019, I had waived the Stamp Duty on Gift Deed documents in favour of wife till March 31, 2022. I now declare to make this exemption permanent;
- (IX) I announce to reduce the Stamp Duty on the documents of purchase of immovable property by elderly persons above 60 years

of age in the state from 6% to 5% and registration fee from 1% to 0.5%;

- (X) Currently, due to shrinking family size and and good employment opportunities away from home towns, children are not available to take care of their parents. In some cases, financial resources of the elderly are also reduced. Banking and financial institutions provide loan facility to such elderly people by keeping immovable property as mortgage. I announce relief to the elderly by giving 100% percent exemption in Stamp Duty and Registration Fee on the documents for execution of reverse mortgage.
- (XI) I announce to provide 100% exemption in Stamp Duty and Registration Fee on documents of loan taken by students from banks and financial institutions for educational purposes.
- 213. I realise that all the sections have suffered hardships due to Covid. Therefore, no new tax is being imposed in the above tax proposals, rather relief of more than Rs. 1500 crore is being provided during this period.
- 214. Apart from these tax proposals, amendments are also proposed in the provisions of some Acts. The detailed objectives and purposes with respect to these amendments are described in the Finance Bill.
- 215. For the implementation of these tax proposals and announcements and for other purposes, some notifications are being issued along with it.

- Our objective is to establish medical colleges in every district of the state. Cueenntly, medical colleges are functioning in 14 districts of the state. In the coming year, medical colleges will also be opened in Sri Ganganagar, Sirohi, Chittorgarh and Dholpur.
- 3. To expand medical services and strengthen infrastructure in the state:
 - I. New Sub Health Centres will be opened in Bibipur, Kirada Chhota (Nimlai) (Bhadra)-Hanumangarh.
 - II. Upgradion of Sub-Health Centres to Primary Health Centres and opening of new primary health centres. These are as follows:

Sub-Health Centres will be upgraded to Primary Health Centres:

Ajabpura (Bansur) - Alwar, Uwar - Bharatpur, Sinli Jagir (Balotra), Mod ka Nimbahera (Asind) - Bhilwara, Poonras, Sadu Choti (Bidasar), Rajpura (Taranagar) - Churu, Udpura - Chittorgarh, Maharia (Lalsot), Deladi, Chandera and Khedi (Bandikui)-Dausa, Kaitri (Sapau)-Dholpur, Jethana- Dungarpur, Meherwala (Tibbi)-Hanumangarh,Vijaypura, Sumail, Bagrana, Didavata (Madhorajpura)-Jaipur, Rajlani (Bhopalgarh), Khopardi, Nanneu (Phalodi)-Jodhpur, Balwara (Sayla), Detakhurd-Jalore, Khedi (Todabhim)-Karauli, Makrana-Nagaur, Phulad (Marwar Junction), Jeevand Kala (Rani)-Pali, Umargarh, Chhapawali (Sadulshahar)-Sriganganagar.

New Primary Health Centres will be opened in:

III. The following Primary Health Centres will be upgraded to Community Health Centres:

- V. Mobile Surgical Unit at Moti Dungri Road, Jaipur will be developed as a satellite hospital.
- VI. Nimbahera-Chittaurgarh Sub District Hospital will be upgraded to District Hospital.
- VII. Ayurveda Dispensaries will be opened in Bachhrara (Ratangarh)-Churu and Bawdikhurd (Phalodi)-Jodhpur.

EDUCATION & SPORTS

- 4. It is proposed to start Pre-Primary **Bal Vatikas** in English Medium Schools. In the coming year, Pre-Primary *Bal Vatikas* will be opened in 1000 schools in the first phase. NTT course qualified candidates will be given priority for this. An annual expenditure of Rs.50 crore will be incurred on this.
- 5. For all-round personality development of students in schools, APJ Abdul Kalam **Personality Development Program** will be started. Under this, 1000

academically meritorious students with excellent performance in cocurricular activities such as debate, essay competition, literary activities and cultural folk arts, will be selected for Exposure Visits to other states and sent for Exchange Programmes.

- For ensuring quality of private educational institutions and coaching centres in the state, and for proper resolution of their problems, a Private Educational Institutions Regulation and Facilitation Board is proposed to be constituted.
- Government Colleges will be opened in the state as follows: Tantoti (Kekri)

 Ajmer, Tahala (Thanagaji) Alwar, Poogal (Khajuwala) Bikaner, Chaurasi, Ramsagada - Dungarpur, Pawta - Jaipur, Sankra (Pokaran), Ramgarh -Jaisalmer, Kalandri-Sirohi, Hindumalkot-Sriganganagar, Bhachundla-Pratapgarh, Mandrayal (Sapotra)-Karauli, Nechhwa (Laxmangarh)-Sikar and Chauth ka Barwara-Sawai Madhopur.

Along with this, Government Girls' Colleges will be opened in Dudu-Jaipur, Khinvsar-Nagaur, Pratapgarh-Alwar, Bada Gudha (Sojat)-Pali and Fatehpur, Shrimadhopur-Sikar.

- 8. Government Girls' College, Sirohi and Nagaur and Government College-Uniyara, Sridungargarh-Bikaner will be upgraded from Undergraduate (UG) to Post Graduate (PG) level. In addition to this, infrastructure facilities will be developed in Government College, Jamdoli-Jaipur at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.
- 9. Various faculties and new subjects will be started in Colleges of the state as follows:
 - I. Faculty of Science in Government Girls' College Bassi-Jaipur, Deogarh-Rajsamand and Tijara-Alwar;
 - II. Faculty of Commerce in Government College Bassi-Jaipur;
 - III. Faculty of Arts (Home Science) in Government College Tijara-Alwar;
 - IV. History, Political Science, Commerce and Economics subjects in Government Girls' College, Kishanpol-Jaipur; and
 - V. Botany as a subject, at post-graduate level in Government Post Graduate College-Barmer.
- 10. To maintain and enhance the quality of education in government technical

and higher educational institutions, I propose to implement the **Rajasthan Higher Technical Education Quality Improvement Scheme** in the coming year. Rs.15 crore will be spent on this. Also, projects related to academic upgradation submitted by various Universities may also be approved after consideration. A provision of Rs.50 crore will be made for this.

- ITIs will be opened in Khamnor-Rajsamand, Maandan (Behror)-Alwar, Kaman, Vair-Bharatpur, Bagru-Jaipur and Bhaniyana (Pokaran), Fatehgarh-Jaisalmer.
- 12. Sports Stadiums will be set up at Baytu-Barmer, Guda (Udaipurwati), Mandawa-Jhunjhunu and Kishangarhbas, Tijara-Alwar. Along with this, other infrastructure facilities including Indoor stadium will be developed in the Sports Stadium of Ratangarh-Churu.

TRANSPORTATION

- 13. Tour operators have suffered losses due to Covid epidemic during the last year, and in initial months of this year as well. I announce full exemption in monthly Motor Vehicle Tax from I October 2021 to 31 March 2022 for airconditioned luxury buses operated by Tour Operators accredidated by Rajasthan Association of Tour Operators (RATO) and the Indian Association of Tour Operators (IATO).
- 14. In the year 2021-22, in order to encourage operation of eVehicles, I had announced reimbursement of SGST to buyers of such vehicles until 31 March, 2022 and a one-time subsidy on 2-wheeler and 3-wheeler eVehicles from Rs.5000 to Rs.10000 and Rs.10000 to Rs.20000 respectively, based on the battery capacity.

I now announce to extend the period of SGST reimbursement and lumpsum grant up to 31 March, 2023.

- No additional tax will be levied on taxi/maxi cabs on assignment as nontransport vehicles.
- 16. A new sub transport office will be opened in Begun-Chittorgarh.

YOUTH, EMPLOYMENT & INDUSTRIES

17. To increase self-employment opportunities for youth, it is proposed to provide 3,300 small commercial vehicles in the state at concessional rates in collaboration between State Government and the private sector in the coming year. Rs.20 crore will be spent on this.

- 18. Under the Mahatma Gandhi NREGA scheme, 200 days employment was provided instead of 100 days to Sahariya, Kathori tribe and specially-abled labourers of the state in the year 2021-22 with a view to provide financial support to them. In continuation to this, 200 days employment will be provided to them in the coming year as well.
- 19. Through Rajasthan Foundation, we have inspired the Rajasthani Diaspora residing in the country and abroad to reconnect with the soil of their state. In view of the invaluable contribution being offered by Rajasthani Diaspora to the state in every field, Chapters of Rajasthan Foundation will be opened in major countries of the world in a phased manner. In the coming year, Rs.10 crore will be spent on increasing the activities of Rajasthan Foundation.
- 20. Industrial zone will be developed at Osian-Jodhpur.

SOCIAL SECURITY

- 21. It is proposed to constitute **Labour Welfare Board** in for skill development and welfare of labourers, workers, street vendors and artisans associated with traditional occupations in the unorganised sector.
- 22. Free building space, electricity and water will be provided by the State Government to any donor for eateries providing meals for the poor for free or at a token price under **Indira Rasoi Yojana**.
- 23. To expand self-help groups in the state and to increase the income of their members:
 - 50 thousand new self-help groups will be constituted to benefit 5.50 lakh rural women
 - II. Rs.300 crore will be provided for Revolving Fund and Community Investment Fund, and Rs.600 crore as loan from banks.
 - III. Rural Haats and Facilitation Centres will be set up in Sawai Madhopur, Jaisalmer, Barmer, Bikaner, Jodhpur and Dausa districts.
- 24. Scheduled Tribe Boys' Hostel will be opened at Tinwari (Osian)-Jodhpur, Nathdwara-Rajsamand and Sawai Madhopur, Ambedkar Hostel at Bhaniyana (Pokaran)-Jaisalmer, Sedwa-Barmer; Devnarayan Boys' Hostel at Begun-Chittorgarh, Minority Boys' Hostel at Dholpur and Minority Girls'

Residential Schools at Abhe Ka Paar (Ramsar)-Barmer.

25. It is proposed to sanction a uniform amount of Rs.2500 per month per student / resident as mess allowance for old age homes, homes for destitute persons, students in all government and aided residential schools and hostels of the state.

Along with this, I propose to make a provision of Rs.100 crore for modern equipment, dining table chairs, etc. for expansion and improvement of mess arrangement in government hostels.

26. A provision of Rs. 10 crore will be made for protection and development of state's waqf properties under the Jan Sahbhagita Yojana.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- 27. While presenting the budget for the year 2022-23, I had announced to sanction Rs.7 crore for non-patchable / damaged roads and Rs.3 crore for missing link for each assembly constituency. Based on the feedback given by the honourable members, I now propose to amend it with a sanction of Rs.10 crore for non-patchable roads / missing links for each assembly constituency.
- 28. Construction of roads and other basic works in different areas of the state are proposed to be undertaken at a cost of about Rs.1147 crore. These works are:

- 30. Various development works related to drainage, renovation and embellishment are proposed to be undertaken in different cities of the state, which are as follows:
 - I. Restoration, beautification of Kapil Sarovar-Kolayat along with provision of water from Indira Gandhi Canal Project will be undertaken. Rs.20 crore will be spent on this.
 - II. In Sawai Madhopur city, construction work of park and walking track will be undertaken along with security wall and CC road on one side of Rajbagh Latia drain near Kotwali. Beautification of Hammir circle will also be take up. Rs.45 crore will be spent on this.
 - III. Ramsagar lake of Hindoli-Bundi will be beautified with construction of bicycle track and park. Rs. 15 crore will be spent for this.
 - IV. Sports Sangam Centre, walking track and premises of Gaushala Maidan complex in Jodhpur will be renovated at the expense of Rs. 13.88 crore.
 - V. Sewerage construction work will be undertaken in Barmer Municipal Council area.
 - VI. DPR will be prepared for drainage of rain and dirty water in Begun-Chittorgarh, Sujangarh-Churu, Makrana, Didwana-Nagaur and Mukundgarh-Jhunjhunu.

DRINKING WATER & GROUND WATER

- 31. To provide drinking water to residents, works related to various drinking water projects will be undertaken. These are as follows:
 - I. Work of Bisalpur Dam based drinking water project Phase-II for Kho-Nagorian-Jaipur will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 133.24 crore.
 - II. Work of Bisalpur Dam based drinking water project Phase-II for the area around Jagatpura, Pratap Nagar and Mahal Road, Jaipur will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 184.89 crore.
 - III. Work of Bisalpur dam based drinking water project for Prithviraj Nagar, Jaipur, Phase-I, Stage-II and Phase-II will be undertaken at a cost of Rs.600 crore.
 - IV. Rs.126 crore 87 lakh will be spent on the promotion of Shahri Jal Yojana, Dausa.
 - V. Rs.62 crore 46 lakh rupees will be spent on the promotion of Mahwa Shahri Jal Yojana.
 - VI. Rural Water Supply Scheme will be upgraded to Urban Water Supply Scheme with proper arrangement of drinking water at a cost Rs.21.86 crore in the newly formed Thanagaji municipality, Alwar.
 - VII. Provision will be made for supply of drinking water from Isarda dam project to Jamwaramgarh.
 - VIII. DPR will be prepared under the Datiwada project in Bilara-Jodhpur to provide drinking water by joining a big pipeline from Devaliya village to Joleji Fozdara.
 - IX. Rural Water Supply Scheme of Bassi-Jaipur will be upgraded to Urban Water Supply Scheme for adequate arrangement of drinking water. This will cost around Rs. 19 crore.
 - X. Sufficient drinking water supply will be arranged by construction of a 2000 kl capacity tank in Jhotwara-Jaipur's Udyog Nagar area. About Rs.10 crore will be spent on this.
 - XI. Existing water supply system will be upgraded for appropriate arrangement of drinking water supply in Laxman Dungri-Jaipur at a cost of Rs.20 crore.
 - XII. Construction of Jodhpur to Rohat-Pali pipeline will be undertaken for

providing drinking water in Rohat-Pali block at a cost of about Rs.28 crore.

- XIII.425 RO Plants will be installed in 7 blocks of Gudamalani and Chauhtan-Barmer to provide clean drinking water to 1,042 colonies. Rs.120 crore will be spent for this.
- XIV. Urban Water Scheme Bhinder-Udaipur will be reconstituted at a cost of Rs.25 crore.
- XV. Work will be undertaken to resolve drinking water problem in Shrimadhopur-Sikar.
- 32. In the 2013-14 budget of my last tenure and now in 2019-20, I had announced drinking water supply projects for 889 villages of Chauhtan, Gudamalani, Dhorimanna and Sindhari in Barmer district and 921 villages and its dhanis of Udaipurwati and Surajgarh in Jhunjhunu district. We have now issued a financial sanction of Rs.4765 crore by taking a loan from JICA. Technical DPR of this project is in its final stage. It is proposed to start work on priority in the coming year by issuing technical approval soon.
- 33. In the budget for the year 2021-22, It was proposed to start a scheme to provide pure drinking water to the the remaining 864 villages and 13 towns and Tehsil Dhod, Sikar, Khandela, Dataramgarh, Shrimadhopur and Neem Ka Thana of Sikar district and Tehsil Chirawa of Jhunjhunu district with 269 villages and 5 towns of Nawalgarh from Kumbharam lift project. As per the new BSR of this project the revised DPR of around 8 thousand 780 crore rupees is in the last phase. As I said earlier, water availability from Yamuna will be necessarily required for this project alongwith IGNP. For which we are constantly making efforts at the level of the Central Government. A provision of Rs.500 crore is proposed to start the work of this scheme in the coming year.
- 34. I had made a budget announcement for constitution of a high-level committee of experts for technical assessment/survey and viability for the total 30 rainfed villages of Bhadra, Nohar and Taranagar, for irrigation by Siddhmukh canal and Sahwa lift canal so as to convert it into command area. In past, several feasibility issues have been pointed out in this area. Now, the works related to irrigation of these villages will be taken up on

priority, based on the feasibility report submitted by experts. A provision of Rs. 100 crore is proposed for this project in the coming year.

- 35. To provide relief to all categories of consumers, I announce 100% rebate on interest and penalty on the outstanding water charges till 31 December 2021 if lumpsum deposit is made by 31 March, 2022.
- 36. **Ground Water Conservation and Management Authority** will be constituted for the judicious use of ground water and facilitation of the industrial units in the state.
- 37. Office of Executive Engineer of Public Health Engineering Department will be opened at Kathumar-Alwar.

ENERGY

- 38. I announce to implement Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) for financial accounting, material management, human resource management and other works of power distribution corporations in the state, on which about Rs.75 crore will be spent.
- 39. To strengthen the distribution system in the state in view of increasing demand for energy:
 - I. 220 KV GSS will be established at Shiv-Barmer.
 - I 32 KV GSS will be established at Phulwara-Bharatpur and Mukam (Nokha), Damolai (Khajuwala)-Bikaner.
 - III. 33 KV GSS will be established at Sainthali, Piproli (Ramgarh), Silibawadi (Thanagaji), Surer (Rajgarh)-Alwar and Salaria (Rani)-Pali.
 - IV. Office of Assistant Engineer (Electrical) will be opened in Hathoj-Jaipur, Gadrarod (Shiva), Aadel (Gudamalani)-Barmer and Office of Executive Engineer (Electrical) will be opened in Sikrai-Dausa.

FOREST & ENVIORNMENT

40. To promote eco-tourism in the state, I announce to develop eco-tourism Lav-Kush Vatika in each district including forest areas and adjoining areas at a cost of about Rs. 2 crore each.

The following will be included: Anasagar Lake-Ajmer; Chuhar Siddha Valley-Alwar; Sawai Mata-Banswara; Shahbad-Baran; Junaptrasar-Barmer; Mandera Rundh-Bharatpur; Bhadak, Chhatrikheda-Bhilwara; Jodbeed-Bikaner; Bhimlat-Bundi; Mohar Magri-Chittorgarh; Shyam Pandiya, Taranagar-Churu; Gol (Mane)-Dausa; Damoh Waterfall-Dholpur; Ratanpur, Bichhiwara-Dungarpur; Dhannasar Barani-Hanumangarh; Nainath Banskhoh-Jaipur; Kanoi-Jaisalmer; Sundha Mata-Jalore; Badbela Talaab-Jhalawar; Mansa Mata-Jhunjhunu; Machia-Jodhpur; Kailadevi Nature Camp-Karauli; Aawali Rozari-Kota; Gogelav-Nagaur; Khobaguda, Desuri-Pali ; Gotmeshwar, Lalgarh-Pratapgarh; Roop Nagar, Jhilwara- Rajsamand; Vijaygarh, Baunli-Sawai Madhopur; Harsh parvat-Sikar; Rajal Dabela-Sirohi; 3 MSD Dabla-Sriganganagar; Bisalpur-Tonk and Machla Magra-Udaipur.

41. In the 2021-22 budget, it was announced to set up Faecal Sludge Treatment Plants (FSTP) in 50 cities deprived of sewerage facility, on which work is progressing at a fast pace. Setting up of FSTPs with related works will be taken up in 68 cities at a cost of Rs.600 crore in the coming year. These are as follows:

42. Sewerage Treatment Plants (STPs) will be established at Jodhpur's MDM Hospital, Umaid Hospital and Kamala Nehru Chest and Tuberculosis Hospital; Udaipur's TB Badi Hospital, Khemraj Katara Hospital and Sundar Singh Bhandari Hospital (Amba Mata); JLN Hospital and Janana Hospital in Ajmer and SRG Hospital in Jhalawar at a cost of Rs.27 crore.

TOURISM, ART & CULTURE

- 43. Restoration work will be undertaken at a cost of Rs.20 crore for the historical stepwells of the state. These are Abhaynath, Nagar-Sagar ka Kund, Bhavaldi, Meera Gate, Malanmasi, Shukla Baori, Bohraji ka Kund, Manohar Baori, Club Baori, Anaar Kali ki Baori and Police Line ki Baori in Bundi district; Badgaon Baori, Khade Ganesh ji in Kota district; Panna Meena ka Kund and Goner Baori in Jaipur district; Jhajhirampura, Bhadravati-Bhandarej in Dausa district, and Todarai Singh ki Baoriyan in Tonk district.
- 44. Rana Hammir Panorama in the memory of Rana Hammir, in Sawai

Madhopur, **Veer Durgadas Panorama** in the memory of the man of indomitable courage and self-respect, Durgadas Rathod in Jodhpur and a **Panorama** in the venture land of **Govind Guru** in Chhani Magri-Dungarpur will be constructed at a cost of Rs. 12 crore.

- 45. Bikaner House is the face of art and culture of Rajasthan in New Delhi, especially its art gallery. Keeping in view this rich heritage, upgradation and development of Bikaner House will be undertaken at a cost of Rs. 15 crore.
- 46. Rest houses other infrastructural facilities will be developed for pilgrims visiting Govardhanji and Braj Chaurasi Kos Parikrama. Also, a light and sound show will be started at Deeg Mahal-Bharatpur.
- 47. I had announced in the year 2021-22, for preparation of the DPR for various works related to prevention of entry of the filth along with rainwater in the holy lake of Pushkar, the religious city. Under which, the work of drain will be undertaken at a cost of about Rs. 11 crore from Varah chowk to Santoshi mata dhani sump via Brahma chowk in the first phase.
- 48. A Jaipur Heritage Fund will be created for conservation, maintenance and management of the Havelis, buildings, etc. of Jaipur's world heritage-walled city area and Rs. 10 crore will be spent in the coming year for these works.
- 49. Conservation, renovation and beautification works will be undertaken in Chota Pana and Bada Pana Chhatriyan, Charoda Dham Talab premises, Gopi Nath Temple and Tingaria Hanuman Temple at Khandela-Sikar.
- 50. Restoration and beautification works will be undertaken at Temple premises and pond at Kailadeviji Temple, at Jheel ka Bara (Bayana) –Bharatpur. Restoration and development works will also be taken up at Bhairav ji Temple-Banswara and Goreshwar Temple. Rs.20 crore will be spent on them.
- 51. To connect science with the common people through Night Sky Astro Tourism and to promote this, Telescopes of high-level resolution will be set up in all the districts of the state and at four major tourist places, parks in Jaipur and at Bikaner House, New Delhi.

HOME

52. Expanding the facilities at Sardar Patel Police Security and Criminal Justice University, Jodhpur, along with the development of infrastructure, an Off-

campus of National Forensic Science University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat will be opened.

- 53. To further strengthen law and order of the state:
 - I. Offices of Deputy Superintendent of Police will be opened in Kailadevi (Sapotra)-Karauli and Virat Nagar-Jaipur.
 - II. New Police Stations will be opened at Bagad Tiraya (Ramgarh) Alwar, Jasol (Pachpadra) – Barmer, Sirohi Sadar – Sirohi, Alsisar (Mandawa), Mehara (Khetri) – Jhunjhunu, Madhorajpura (Chaksu) – Jaipur, Mamchari (Sapotra) – Karauli and Nasirda (Deoli) Tonk.
 - III. New Police Checkposts will be opened at Timeda Bada (Kushalgarh)-Banswara, Peh (Parbatsar)-Nagaur, Chhan (Khandar)-Sawai Madhopur, Mithod (Pipalda)-Kota and Sever (Bari)-Dholpur.
- 54. Out of the 150 police stations located at the municipal headquarters of the state, 108 are CI level police stations. The remaining 42 police stations of SI level will also be upgraded to CI level police stations in the coming year.
- 55. In the coming year, to provide easy and speedy justice to the common man:
 - I. Senior Civil Judge and Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Courts will be opened in Chauhtan-Barmer and Gharsana-Sriganganagar.
 - II. Special Court (POCSO Act) will be opened in Nagaur.
 - III. In Osian-Jodhpur Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Court will be upgraded to Senior Civil Judge and Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court.
 - IV. NI Act Court will be opened in Sikar.
 - V. Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Courts will be opened in Dhod-Sikar, Masuda-Ajmer, Peeplu-Tonk, Sarmathura-Dholpur, Bilara-Jodhpur and Salumbar-Udaipur.

GOOD GOVERNANCE

- 56. Today, more than 500 services are being provided to residents close to home through eMitra. This will be expanded by providing about 200 other public utility services of the private sector like eCommerce, eEducation, agriculture sector and medical consultation etc. through eMitra.
- 57. I propose to compute gratuity and leave encashment amount, payable on retirement to government employees who retired during the period

January 01, 2020 to June 30, 2021, at the effective rate of dearness allowance at the time of their retirement. A financial burden of about Rs.400 crore will be borne on this.

- 58. The previous government via order on 5 October, 2018 had sanctioned extra-ordinary leave for the period of strike undertaken by the employee and this said period was not considered for 'Qualifying Service'. Now, keeping in view the interest of the employees, I propose to recognise the period of such sanctioned extraordinary leave for Qualifying service.
- 59. Cash benefit under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) was payable to teachers of colleges and universities from the date of their screening. In view of the demands raised by teachers of these institutions, it is proposed to grant the cash benefit from the date of eligibility for CAS payable on and after 1 January, 2018.
- 60. For expansion and strengthening of administrative units in the state:
 - I. New Subdivision Offices are proposed to be opened in Dechu (Lohawat)-Jodhpur and Jobner-Jaipur.
 - II. Revenue Appellate Officer (Camp Court) court will be opened at Phagi-Jaipur.
 - III. Nirjharna (Lalsot)-Dausa, Deh (Jaayal)-Nagaur, Talavada (Gangapur City), Barnala (Bamanwas)-Sawai Madhopur, Dhod, Patan (Neemkathana)-Sikar and Jhalara-Udaipur Sub Tehsils will be upgraded to Tehsils.
 - IV. Sub Tehsils will be opened in Mirzapur (Anta) Baran, Panchu (Nokha), Dantor (Khajuwala), Jasrasar (Nokha) – Bikaner, Suwana, Tonkarwad – Bhilwara, Hamirwas Bada (Rajgarh) – Churu, Pilani – Jhunjhunu and Dhunwakalan (Deoli) – Tonk
 - V. I have been receiving memorandums from time to time from honourable house, public representatives and residents regarding the formation of new districts. I propose to constitute a high-level committee to provide recommendations within a period of 6 months for formation of new districts based on assessment of these memorandums and on quality-based assessment.
- 61. Municipalities will be formed in Hammirgarh-Bhilwara, Raniwada-Jalore,

Manoharpur-Jaipur, Balesar-Jodhpur and Gudha (Udaipurwati)-Jhunjhunu, Semari (Khairwara)-Udaipur. Also, Pokaran-Jaisalmer Municipality will be upgraded from grade IV to grade III. In addition, Panchayat Samiti will be formed at Bagdi (Sojat)-Pali.

- 62. Mess allowance payable to various service cadres of the state viz. Police Constable, Head Constable, Jail Prahari, Home Guard Constable, Nursing Staff, Excise Department personnel, etc. will be increased by 10% from April 01, 2022.
- 63. Because of Covid-19, the Rajasthan State Cooperative Election Authority could not conduct elections for many eligible cooperative societies during the last two years. In the coming year, elections will be conducted for all such eligible cooperative societies in a phased manner.

AGRICULTURE & ALLIED FIELDS

- 64. Agriculture colleges will be opened at Tijara-Alwar, Shahbad-Baran, Gudamalani-Barmer and Sawai Madhopur in the state. Offices of Assistant Director (Agriculture Extension) will be opened in Jobner-Jaipur, Kushalgarh-Banswara and Sridungargarh-Bikaner.
- 65. To promote production and sale of organic products and vegetables grown by farmers, arrangements will be made for the purchase of organic products and other agricultural commodities and their sale at grocery stores, Confed and co-operative departmental stores, Reliance stores, Dmart stores, Metro stores, etc.
- 66. To prevent weed growth and maintain soil moisture between the crop rows, plastic mulching will be planted in an area of 10000 hectares.
- 67. In the coming year, more than 50000 works will be taken up including Nursery workshop, Work-Shade factory (Building Material Production Centre), Cattle-shed and Nutri-Centre within Panch-Shala Yojana under Mahatma Gandhi NREGA Scheme.
- 68. As per the demand of farmers to provide fertilizers in sufficient quantity, work of advance storage of 2 lakh metric tonnes of urea and 1 lakh metric tonnes of DAP will be undertaken in the coming year. Rs.20 crore will be spent on this.
- 69. Krishi Upaj Mandi will be opened in Gijgarh-Dausa and Railmagra-
Rajsamand. Also, Gaun (Secondary) Mandi of Chhatargarh (Khajuwala)-Bikaner will be declared as Krishi Upaj Mandi.

- 70. Veterinary Hospital will be opened in Pareu (Gida) Barmer. Veterinary Sub-Health Centres will be opened at Padampura, Chidasan (Chirawa)-Jhunjhunu and Aspur (Nawan)-Nagore.
- 71. To encourage more and more girls to join Veterinary education, I announce to increase the current payable stipend from Rs.3500 to Rs.14000.
- 72. Special repair work of Madhopur Beas Link and Madhopur Beas Creek constructed in the year 1954-55 is proposed to be undertaken through Government of Punjab. With this, additional water of Ravi river will be available to the state through Indira Gandhi canal feeder as per its discharge capacity of 10000 cusec.
- 73. Work of Chambal-Panchana-Jagar Lift Project will be undertaken.
- 74. Anicut Ravanjana Dungar will be constructed on the drain at Sawai Madhopur district headquarter.
- 75. Pucca canal/lane will be constructed in Sadulshahr-Sriganganagar.
- 76. In Dungarpur, repair work of right and left canals of Upper Ghodi Talaab and construction of incomplete canals will be undertaken.
- 77. Construction work of WHS in Dulhepura (Khandela)-Sikar will be undertaken.
- 78. Irrigation facility will be developed at a cost of Rs.20 crore on about 1500 hectares of land from 50 lift irrigation schemes through solar energy based community water lifting irrigation scheme for the farmers of tribal areas.

MEDICAL & HEALTH

- To further improve the facilities of angiography and angioplasty, Cath Labs will be established at Bikaner, Jodhpur, Udaipur and Ajmer medical colleges.
- 2. For providing prompt and free first-aid accessibility to residents near their homes in slums of urban areas and mohallas of low- income groups, we had started the setting up of 100 Janta /mohalla clinics on PPP mode. Only 13 Mohalla Clinics have been set up so far. Owing to the slow pace of setting up of Mohalla Clinics on PPP and in collaboration with Bhamashahs, we have now decided to start the work of setting up of 135 Mohalla Clinics are proposed to be established in the coming year. Approximately Rs.200 crore will be spent on these. I would also like to request the honourable MLAs that Mohalla Clinic will be set up at the place of their choice on priority, if 50% of the one-time expenditure of Rs.90 lakh on this is made available from MLA fund.
- 3. During the **Covid Health Assistants** and **Covid Health Consultants** were engaged with budget from State Finance Commission (SFC) to ensure the medical arrangements in every part of the state. From the coming year, no budget will be taken from SFC for this work and in view of the work done by these Covid personnel, I propose to constitute **Medical Health Volunteer Force.**
- 4. To promote eye storage and eye transplantation in the state, besides imparting training to ophthalmologists in Keratoplasty in every medical college/district hospital, 5000 cornea collection work will be undertaken in the coming year. Rs. 10 crore will be spent on this.
- 5. For expanding medical services and strengthening infrastructure in the state:
 - Sub Health Centres will be opened in Gundali (Kishangarh)-Ajmer, Fagnian, Gainian (Gangrar)- Chittorgarh, Dahar (Chaksu)-Jaipur and Khumanpura (Khamnor)- Rajsamand.
 - II. Upgradation of Sub-Health Centres to Primary Health Centres and opening of new Primary Health Centres are proposed as follows:

Primary Health Centres will be upgraded to Community Health Centres, which are as follows: Jakhrana (Behror)-Alwar; Railawan (Kishanganj)-Baran; Namana- Bundi; Pathaina (Vair)-Bharatpur; Jodhiasi (Jayal)-Nagaur; Daudsar (Ratangarh)-Churu; Garh (Sikrai), Chhareda- Dausa; Ramgarh (Aaspur)-Dungarpur; Tala (Jamvaramgarh), Sakhoon (Dudu) - Jaipur; Jhajhar (Nawalgarh)- Jhunjhunu; Surwal-Sawai Madhopur; Toda (Srimadhopur), Bibipur (Fatehpur)-Sikar and Chanvad (Salumbar)-Udaipur.

- IV. Dispensary will be opened at Bhatta Basti-Jaipur.
- V. Sub-District Hospitals will be opened at Rajkheda-Dholpur, Srikolayat-Bikaner, Mandal-Bhilwara and Nawan-Nagore.
- VI. Maternal and Child Health Centres will be started in Lalsot-Dausa, Bhim-Rajsamand, Sikar and Khandela-Sikar.
- VII. Community Health Centre, Amer-Jaipur will be upgraded to Satellite hospital.
- VIII. Trauma Centre will be opened at Gangrar-Chittorgarh.
- IX. Ayurveda Dispensary will be opened at Tausar-Nagaur.
- X. Homeopathy Dispensary will be started at Sadri (Lohawat)-Jodhpur.
- 6. Recently, many students of the state had to leave their medical studies half way and had to come back from Ukraine to Rajasthan due to the ongoing problem between Russia and Ukraine. In future, to provide more opportunities for the students of the State to pursue medical studies in the state itself, I propose to introduce a new policy for opening of medical colleges in the private sector and to encourage expansion of existing medical colleges.
- 7. Directorate of Food Safety has been established to give continuity to our "Shudh ke live Yudh" campaign, for ensuring quality in food items for consumers in the state. Similarly, availability of proper medicines for residents is a more sensitive issue. Therefore, we will add this also to the on-going campaign. For this, I now announce integration of Food Safety Directorate and Drug Control Association and constitution of Food Safety and Drug Control Commissionerate by appointing a senior IAS officer as the Commissioner, for further strengthening it.
- 8. To provide quality medication under Naturopathy, Yoga and Ayurveda, it is proposed to operate **Medi-Tourism Wellness Centre** at Nathdwara-Rajsamand on pilot basis under the aegis of district level society through an experienced social organisation.
- 9. During my last tenure in the year 2010, Haldiram Moolchand Cardiovascular Sciences Centre was established in PBM Hospital-Bikaner

with assistance from a benefactor. Now, I announce to upgrade it as Cardiovascular Centre of Excellence through public support.

 Capacity in Madan Mohan Malviya Government Ayurveda College, Udaipur will be increased by 50 beds by upgrading 6 undergraduate (UG) departments to postgraduate (PG).

EDUCATION

- 11. While presenting the budget, I had made announcements related to upgradation of schools, to further strengthen the infrastructure of school education. Towards this, a large number of proposals have been received from honourable members for opening new subjects in schools and for upgradation of primary schools to upper primary and from upper primary to senior secondary schools. Keeping in view the need in this sector, I announce to upgrade 500 government primary schools to upper primary schools and 250 upper primary schools to senior secondary schools in the coming year. Along with this, it is proposed to start new subjects/faculties in 500 government schools.
- 12. Under the Right to Education Act (RTE), for ease of uninterrupted education of girl students studying in private schools, I announce the reimbursement of fees from 'Indira Mahila Shakti Nidhi' benefitting more than 18000 girls every year. An annual provision of Rs. 18 crore will be made for this.
- 13. For those girls and women who are unable to attend college or university on regular basis due to family and other reasons, I announce to implement 'Balika Doorasth Shiksha Yojana' to link them with higher education through distance education. Under this, the fee payable for UG, PG, Diploma, Certificate Courses, etc. will be reimbursed. An expenditure of Rs. 15 crore will be done on this.
- 14. Health and Physical Education will be started as an optional subject in 254 schools of the state in which the post of Lecturer (Physical education) is approved.
- 15. The importance of digital learning has increased in today's scenario. To provide benefits to students of low-income group, a provision of Rs.50 crore is proposed for providing eLibrary and other necessary facilities in

residential educational institutions under various departments and for classes 9th to 12th in selected schools.

- 16. For the expansion of higher education in the state:
 - Government Colleges will be opened, as follows: Bijaynagar, Rupangarh-Ajmer; Neemrana-Alwar; Anandpuri-Banswara; Nahargarh (Kishanganj) - Baran; Siddhmukh (Sadulpur)-Churu; Pal Deval-Dungarpur; Aandhi (Jamvaramgarh), Kishangarh Renwal-Jaipur; Tibbi, Rawatsar-Hanumangarh; Buhana-Jhunjhunu, Revatara-Jalore and Kurabad (Vallabhnagar)-Udaipur.
 - II. Girls' Colleges will be opened, as follows: Baroda Meo-Alwar; Siwana-Barmer; Kelwara (Kishanganj), Chhabra-Baran; Mandal-Bhilwara; Jhalatala (Vair), Deeg- Bharatpur; Bassi-Chittorgarh; Marina (Rajakheda)-Dholpur; Gangapol-Jaipur; Lohawat-Jodhpur; Panchala Siddha (Khimsar)-Nagaur; Alsisar (Mandawa), Mandrella-Jhunjhunu; Katkar-Karauli; Shivganj-Sirohi; Mitrapura (Bamanwas)-Sawai Madhopur and Niwai-Tonk.
 - III. New subjects in Jamwaramgarh-Jaipur, Rajgarh-Alwar; and new faculties and subjects will be started in 50 colleges including science and commerce faculties in Bali-Pali, Fagi, Viratnagar-Jaipur and science faculty at Nawan-Nagaur, Hod (Khandela)-Sikar.
 - IV. 25 colleges including Viratnagar-Jaipur, Pokaran-Jaisalmer and Sarada (Salumbar)-Udaipur will be upgraded to PG.
 - V. Sanskrit College, Kotkasim-Alwar will be converted into a regular Government College.
- 17. Devnarayan Girls' Hostel at Sikandra (Sikrai), Bandikui-Dausa, Peeplu (Niwai)-Tonk and Malarna Dungar-Sawai Madhopur, Minority Hostel at Phalodi-Jodhpur, Minority Girls' Hostel at Dausa and Nagar-Bharatpur, Scheduled Caste Hostel at Lohawat-Jodhpur, Sarmathura-Dholpur and Tribal Boys' Hostel will be opened in Chhabra-Baran, Dariyati (Chairasi)-Dungarpur. In addition, Savitri Bai Phule Hostels will be started at Kareda (Mandal)-Bhilwara, Chhabra-Baran, Gudha Ponkh (Udaipurwati)-Jhunjhunu, Nohar-Hanumangarh.
- 18. ITI Centres will be opened at Hindoli-Bundi, Hamirgarh-Bhilwara, Sawa-

Chittorgarh, Todabhim-Karauli, Niwai-Tonk and Sarada (Salumbar)-Udaipur.

- 19. Non-Engineering graduate courses viz., Fine Arts, Visual Arts, Textile Designing and Fashion Designing will commence from the coming year in Women Polytechnic Colleges located at Gandhinagar and Sanganer-Jaipur.
- 20. In view of present circumstances, it is very important for girls to be mentally and physically strong. Keeping this in view, self-defense and awareness training is being imparted to girl students in government schools. Training has been given to about 30000 girls this year. I propose self-defense training to be imparted to 2 lakh girls under **Rani Laxmibai Self Defense Training Campaign** in the coming year.
- 21. Keeping in mind the relevance of Mahatma Gandhi's principles, ideals and philosophy, in the 2021-22 budget a 'Directorate of Peace and Non-Violence' was announced to be set up. Under this Directorate, an expenditure of Rs. 5 crore is proposed on various programmes, trainings, etc.
- 22. Also, with the aim of promoting Khadi in the state:
 - I. Khadi Kamgar Aarthik Prothsahan Yojana will be implemented with the objective of providing adequate remuneration to workers of Khadi sector such as katins, weavers and workers. Under this, about 20000 Khadi workers will be benefitted. An expenditure of Rs.18 crore will be made for this in the coming year.
 - II. In Kota, Jodhpur, Bharatpur and Bikaner divisions, Training Centres will be started to impart training to katins and weavers.

YOUTH, SPORTS AND EMPLOYMENT

23. In view to empower women financially, I announce the establishment of Mahila Co-operative Bank - **Rajasthan Mahila Nidhi** in Jaipur through Rajivika by associating members of women self-help groups. Loans will be easily available to members for their daily needs and self-employment through this 'Mahila Bank'. Initially, a contribution of Rs.50 crore is proposed to be provided by the state government in the next two years for establishment of this 'Mahila Bank'. Also, with a view to give impetus to formation of women self-help groups in urban areas along with rural sector, it is proposed to undertake complete work of women self-help groups in

the state through Rajivika.

- 24. To generate employment and industrial development in tribal dominated and other backward areas, I propose a provision of special package under RIPS-2022 to attract industrial units.
- 25. To create an extensive environment of sports in the state, in the last budget, I had announced organising of Rural Olympics. Due to Corona these games could not be conducted this year. Now along with organising rural Olympics in the coming year, it is also proposed to organise a State Level Sports Competition at a cost of about Rs.50 crore.
- 26. Along with this, I announce to grant priority to district and state level winners of Rural Olympics in recruitment of vacant posts of Panchayat Contractual Cadre.
- 27. To promote sports, cash prizes are given by the state government to the medal winning players. In this sequence, I propose to implement **Sports Person Pension Scheme** in the coming year for the medal winners of Olympic, Asian and Commonwealth Games and sports persons/para players/coaches honored with Arjuna and Dronacharya awards. Under this, a pension of Rs.20000 per month will be provided to such players on completion of 40 years of age.
- 28. With the objective of developing sports facilities and promoting physical exercise in the state:
 - I. Adventure Sports Training and Mountaineering Centre will be set up for adventure sports at Mount Abu-Sirohi at a cost of Rs. 10 crore.
 - II. Open Gym will be established in every district stadium. Also, State of the Art Gym & Fitness Centres will be established at all the divisional headquarters including Sawai Mansingh Stadium-Jaipur and Barkatullah Khan Cricket Stadium-Jodhpur at a cost of about Rs.35 crore.
 - III. Sports stadium will be constructed at Umrain-Alwar. Also, development works will be undertaken in the sports stadiums of Kuchaman-Nagaur and Bundi.

SOCIAL SECURITY

29. In the 2021-22 budget, I had announced Denotified Tribes (DNT) Policy for the upliftment of deprived, nomadic and semi-nomadic communities of the

state. Towards this, for upliftment and rehabilitation of communities like Gadolia, Banjara, Kalbelia, Bhopa Nayak, Gadiya Luhar, Pardi, Bhedkut, Raibari, Mogia, Sikligar, Sigdiwal, Rangaswamy (devotee of Shani Maharaj), Nath, Bhand, Rana, Baagigar, Gujarati, Bagaria, Sansi, Kanjar, Janglia etc. an additional provision of Rs.100 crore is proposed to be made by including them in the **Navjeevan Yojana**. Special initiatives will undertaken for promoting education in their localities.

- 30. In view of increased cost of building construction, I announce to increase the grant amount under Maharana Pratap Awas Anudan Yojna for the Gadaria Lohars from **Rs.70 thousand to Rs.I.20 lakh**. Also, in order to make Gadaria Lohars self-reliant, it is proposed to increase the assistance amount for self-employment under the *Swarozgar hetu kacha maal krya yojana* from **Rs.5000 to Rs.I0000.**
- 31. Ambedkar DBT Voucher Yojana was implemented for residential facility to college students of state SC, ST, OBC, MBC and EBC category. Now expanding this Scheme, students from minority community will also be included in it.
- 32. I announce to provide monthly financial assistance of Rs.I,000 in addition to the pension amount to such specially abled persons, who have to depend on others for their daily needs.
- 33. Scheme for hassle-free, **free door step delivery** of ration will be implemented for such NFSA families of the state, in which all the members are either less than 18 years of age or are more than 60 years of age or are disabled and as a result are unable to bring ration on their own. Approximately Rs.25 crore will be spent under this scheme. Additionally, I announce to open 5000 new ration shops in the coming year for NFSA families residing in various parts of the state to get rations close to their home.
- 34. To improve the nutritional value of mid-day meals in government schools, milk will be provided for 2 days in a week using Powder Milk from the coming year. This will cost **Rs.500 crore**.
- 35. I announce electrification of all un-electrified 43,060 Anganwadi Centres in the state in a phased manner in the next two years. For this, provision is

proposed to be made for monthly electricity expenditure and one-time expenditure of Rs.21.53 crore.

36. Under the Mukhya Mantri Madrasa Aadhunikaran Yojana, infrastructure development, computerisation, expansion and strengthening of furniture and other facilities is proposed at a cost of Rs.40 crore.

FOREST AND ENVIRONMENT

- 37. Under the Wildlife Surveillance Project, arrangements have been made for protection and conservation of wildlife species in Jhalana, Sariska, Ranthambore and Mukundara. By extending this protection, conserved areas will also be included. An expenditure of Rs.30 crore is proposed on this.
- 38. DPR will be prepared to develop Sikar's Nani Beed area as Eco Park and Bird Sanctuary.
- 39. For proper resolution of the problem of sewerage and waste in the state:
 - Sewerage and other related works will be undertaken in Kotputli-Jaipur, Nokha-Bikaner, Keshoraipatan-Bundi, Jaisalmer, Barmer, Balotra-Barmer, Dungarpur, Rajsamand and Bharatpur at a cost of Rs.1,000 crore.
 - II. Sewerage and drainage works will be undertaken in Rawatbhata-Chittaurgarh, Pipad City (Bilara)-Jodhpur. Also, DPR will be prepared for sewerage and drainage work in Sridungargarh-Bikaner.
 - III. To solve the problem of water logging in Sapotra, construction of drain and other related works will be undertaken.
 - IV. Biogas / methane will be produced by processing the liquid waste in cities at the cost of Rs. I 25 crore.
 - V. Work related to solid and liquid waste management will be undertaken at all gram panchayat headquarters in a phased manner.

BASIC INFRASTRUCTURE

- 40. To provide relief to people residing on agricultural land in urban areas and earning livelihood post 17 June, 1999, the Cabinet recently approved the amendment in sub-section 8 of section 90-A of the Rajasthan Land Revenue Act. Similarly, to provide relief to residents of *kachi basti*:
 - I. I announce to extend the cut-off date for regulation of possession in

the surveyed kachi bastis from 15.08.2009 to 31.12.2021.

- II. In the earlier provision of lease being non-transferrable, a provision has been made in the Prashsan Shaharo ke Sang campaign-2021 that such lease would be transferable after 10 years of issuance of the lease. I announce making this 10-year period 3 years.
- III. For plots of 110 square yards to 200 square yards, I announce to grant lease of the said additional occupied portion at 10% of the reserved rate or of the DLC rate, whichever is less.
 At the same time, to benefit maximum people, it is also proposed to

At the same time, to benefit maximum people, it is also proposed to extend the duration of the ongoing 'Prashsan Shaharo ke Sang ' campaign from 31 March, 2022 to 31 March, 2023.

41. Construction of roads, strengthening, widening and other basic works are proposed to be undertaken in different parts of the state at a cost of about Rs. 1,260 crore; these works are:

- 42. Road from Indira Gandhi Nagar, Jagatpura-Jaipur to Bassi in Jaipur will be constructed by Jaipur Development Authority at a cost of Rs.50 crore and elevated road from Pulan intersection to Sukhadia Circle via Fatehpur intersection will be constructed by UIT, Udaipur at a cost of Rs.120 crore. Also, DPR will be prepared to solve the problem of Kot Gate and Sankhla Gate crossings of Bikaner city.
- 43. ROB will be constructed in place of RUB on LC-142 in Rajgarh-Alwar, and RUB will be constructed on Narsisar to Kuchaur route in Sridungargarh-Bikaner. Also, DPR will be prepared for construction of RUB in Siddhmukh-Chagra and Bhaujan-Hamirwas in Churu. Apart from this, foot overbridge at Kathuwas (Neemrana)-Alwar and underpass at Bayana-Bharatpur will be constructed.
- 44. 32 first class multi-storey residential units will be constructed by dismantling the 40 old quarters of the Old Transit Hostel Campus located at Gandhinagar-Jaipur at a cost of Rs.44 crore.
- 45. Beautification and development work of Salam Sagar Talab (Pokaran) Jaisalmer will be undertaken. Along with this, Anasagar Scape Channel bridge will be constructed in Ajmer.
- 46. In the second phase of flood rescue project in Anta-Baran, works including widening of the bay, embellishment along with bridge, protection wall will be undertaken. Along with this, work of second phase of flood rescue project will also be started in Baran-Atru city.

DRINKING WATER AND GROUND WATER

47. Honourable Speaker, I have been apprised from time to time by the honourable house, our *sarpanchas*, as well as by residents rural areas about the problems related to the Janta Jal Yojana. Panchayats face problems in operating drinking water schemes under this Scheme due to lack of

financial resources and due to non-availability of technical manpower. Therefore, for seamless operation of drinking water schemes under the Janata Jal Yojana, I announce to accord these schemes to the PHED department.

- 48. Approximately Rs.283 crore will be spent on replacement and upgradation works of dilapidated pipelines and consumer water connections in the walled city and other areas of Jaipur city. Also, DPR will be prepared for work of covering the drains near Hawa Mahal of Jaipur.
- 49. Work will be undertaken to provide drinking water from Hamera Dam-Chittorgarh at a cost of Rs. 16 crore.
- 50. Office of Junior Engineer (Public Health Engineering) will be opened at Bagri (Sojat)-Pali and Office of Assistant Engineer (Public Health Engineering) will be opened at Malkheda-Alwar, Andhi (Jamvaramgarh) -Jaipur, Gangrar-Chittorgarh and Losal (Dhod)-Sikar.

ENERGY

- 51. The policies laid down by us for the amplification of wind and solar energy have been appreciated universally, and owing to this, the state holds a leading position in the field of Renewal Energy. To leverage renewal energy for development of the state, it is propsed that under these policies necessary provision will be made to provide to the state a share of power produced by investors.
- 52. Keeping in view the increasing demand for energy, for strengthening the distribution system in the state:
 - I. 220 KV Sub Station will be set up at Maniyan (Rajakheda)-Dholpur.
 - II. 132 KV GSS will be set up at Sola-Sikar and Jawal-Sirohi.
 - III. 33 KV GSS will be set up at Majra Dhakoda (Banasur) Alwar, Dand (Khajuwala) Bikaner, Konra (Chhattan) Barmer, Amargarh (Mandal) Bhilwara, Ramsinghpur Palki, Teski (Nagar) Bharatpur, Tambakhedi, Kalri (Taranagar) Churu, Kundera (Sikrai) Dausa, Kahari (Aaspur) Dungarpur, Silasan (Raniwada) Jalore and Bhojasar, Shyampura Nua (Mandawa) Jhunjhunu.
 - IV. Office of Assistant Engineer (Electrical) will be opened at Chikani-Alwar, Daveda (Aaspur), Pal Deval-Dungarpur and Bagor (Mandal)-

Bhilwara, Ramgarh Pachwara (Lalsot), Baijupada-Dausa, Ramgarh (Ramgarh-Shekhawati)-Sikar, Keladevi-Karauli. Along with this, Office of Executive Engineer (Electrical) will be opened at Vair-Bharatpur, Jamwaramgarh-Jaipur, Sikrai-Dausa and Baunli (Bamanwas)-Sawai Madhopur.

TOURISM, ARTS & CULTURE

- 53. Considering the immense potential of tourism, historical places and monuments located in the state such as Mira Memorial (Rao Dudagarh), Merta-Nagaur, Musi Maharani ki Chhatri and Neelkanth-Alwar, Ajit Vivek Museum, Khetri-Jhunjhunu, State Museum-Bharatpur, Molela (Khamnor) – Rajsamand, etc. will be developed at a cost of Rs. 10 crore. I also announce to spend Rs.5 crore for restoration of Churu Fort.
- 54. Jogeshwar Dham (Nawan) Nagaur will be developed as a tourist destination. Along with this, tourism development and restoration works will be undertaken in Goth Manglod (Jayal)-Nagaur and Suiya Dham (Chahtan)-Barmer. Apart from this, Shridevnarayan Panorama will be created at Jodhpuria (Niwai)-Tonk.
- 55. To promote religious tourism, basic infrastructure works will be undertaken at selected sites while conducting a survey of temples, mosques, dargahs, gurudwaras, churches and other religious places. Access routes of Jaipur's Shri Govind Devji temple will be renovated, beautified and public facilities will be increased for convenience of devotees. Along with this, the route of Idgah area located near Galta Gate of Jaipur will be renovated and public facilities will be expanded. A provision of Rs.30 crore is proposed for all these works in the coming year.
- 56. We had started Varisht Nagrik Thirth Yojana in the year 2013. Under the scheme, it was announced in the 2021-22 budget to increase the number of devotees to be sent on pilgrimage from 10000 to 20000, but due to the restrictions of Covid-19, senior citizens could not take advantage of this Scheme. In the coming year, an increased number of elderly people will be able to get the benefit under this pilgrimage scheme. Rs.30 crore is likely to be spent on this Scheme.
- 57. In order to help the tourism industry of the state affected by the Covid-19

epidemic, I announce for the complete exemption on rent / montly fee payable to the Archaeological and Museum Department of Rajasthan for the period during the second wave of Covid-19 when the tourism activities were completely banned.

Along with this, it is also proposed for proportionate rebate to be given on the rent /monthly license fee on the basis of decline in tourist arrivals during the period up to 31 August, 2021 from the date of the aforesaid ban.

AGRICULTURE AND ALLIED SECTORS

- 58. Agricultural Colleges will be opened in the state at Borwat-Banswara, Baran, Phuliakalan (Shahpura)-Bhilwara, Bharatpur, Nagar-Bharatpur, Bassi-Chittorgarh, Bahrawanda (Sikrai)-Dausa and Barwanda Khurd (Khandar)-Sawai Madhopur.
- 59. Agricultural Mandi will be developed in Rauthadia (Mahwa)-Dausa.
- 60. For the convenience of rural residents and farmers, I propose to set up 'Panchayat Mini Secretariat' at Gram Panchayats in a phased manner. Through these, services and facilities of concerned departments – Revenue, Agriculture, Rural Development and Panchyat Raj – will be available for Panchayat level employees under one roof. Initially, these works will be undertaken in those gram panchayats, where honourable members sanction Rs.20 lakh from their MLA LAD fund. The state government will provide the remaining 50% amount for such places.
- 61. Along with this, to strengthen Panchayats, I also announce the formation of Panchayat Cadre by creating 50000 posts for various works under the Contractual Service Rules.
- 62. User Charge of 0.50% was levied instead of charging mandi fee or farmer welfare fee on non-notified agricultural commodities and food items. I have received memorandums from traders of various mandis for reducing the amount of this user charge. Therefore, it is proposed to reduce this user charges from 0.50% to 0.25%.
- 63. To provide relief to tenant farmers in the state, the land revenue of command area on agricultural land has been waived off since financial year 2018-19 (Kharif Samvat 2075). I further announce to abolish the outstanding amount of land revenue even prior to financial year 2018-19.

- 64. Anicuts will be constructed at Nayawas Dhani near village Bitholi (Bamanwas) - Sawai Madhopur and over Anas River Garadiya (Gangdtalai) -Banswara. In addition, repair and strengthening work of Hathwari-Khiria Minor Irrigation Project and Chindalia Anicut in Kishanganj - Baran will be undertaken. Apart from this, DPR will be prepared for construction of anicuts at Tamdia (Chaksu), Ajmeripura (Kotkhavda) - Jaipur and Riska ki Naal (Chairasi) - Dungarpur.
- 65. Work related to renovation/restoration of canals/minor and LMC/Sluice at Dorai Dam-Chittorgarh will be undertaken. Also, it is proposed to increase the height of Machhli Dam (Nainwa)-Bundi.
- 66. For proper development and conservation of pasture land in the state, it is proposed to constitute a 'Gauchar Bhoomi Vikas Board'.
- 67. To enhance high-quality cattle breed in the state, it is proposed to conduct 40 lakh artificial insemination using sex sorted semen at subsidised rates in the next two years. For this, about Rs. 100 crore will be spent in the coming year.
- 68. In the budget presented on February 23, 2022, under the Mukhya Mantri Dudh Utpadak Sambal Yojana, making of subsidy of Rs.5 per liter payable to milk producers was widely appreciated. However, it has come to my notice that some dairy unions have decided to increase the milk rate, which cannot be justified. Therefore, RCDF will be interdicted in this regard to ensure that the directions are given to milk unions for not increasing the milk rate and to withdraw the orders of increment of rates if it has been implemented anywhere.
- 69. Along with the formation of District Milk Union in Baran, Milk Processing Plant will also be established.
- 70. Embryo Transplant Technology (ETT) laboratories will be set up at Government Veterinary Colleges located at Bikaner, Jaipur and Udaipur for protection and promotion of indigenous milch cattle breeds of the state. Embryo transplant facility will be developed at Veterinary Hospitals of divisional headquarters including Zojawar (Marwar Junction)-Pali.
- 71. Office of the Fisheries Department will be opened in Churu in view of the possibilities of production and export of shrimp in salt water, employment

generation at the local level and increasing the income of fish farmers.

- 72. Currently, for diagnosis and confirmation of diseases like bird flu, etc. in animals and birds, samples are sent to High Security Lab located at Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh). In view of the need of such a lab in the state, modern Bio Security Lab-3 (BSL-3) will be established in Jaipur.
- 73. For the expansion and improvement of veterinary facilities in the state:
 - I. Veterinary Science Colleges will be opened at Bharatpur and Kotputli-Jaipur.
 - II. First Grade Government Veterinary Hospital, Nawalgarh-Jhunjhunu will be upgraded to Multipurpose Veterinary Hospital.
 - III. Veterinary Hospitals of Harsoli (Kishangarhbas)-Alwar, Matoda (Lohawat)-Jodhpur and Edwa (Degana)-Nagore will be upgraded to First Grade Hospitals.
 - IV. Veterinary Sub Centres of Pada (Raini)-Alwar, Fatehgarh Salla-Ajmer, Ramnagar-Bundi and Riwali, Dabur (Bamanwas)-Sawai Madhopur will be upgraded into veterinary hospitals. Also, Veterinary Hospital will be opened at Noore ki Bhurj (Phalodi)-Jodhpur.
 - V. Veterinary Sub Centres will be opened at Milakpur (Ramgarh) Alwar, Rolia (Kapasaan), Govalia (Begun) - Chittaurgarh, Kupali, 30 APD (Raisinghnagar) - Sriganganagar, Hingoli (Bhopalgarh), Mayakoria (Phalodi), Sheikh Nagar (Bilara) - Jodhpur and Barol Kadila (Malpura) -Tonk.

HOME

- 74. For the strengthening of law and order and traffic system in the state:
 - I. On 3 March, 2022, I had announced to upgrade the remaining 42 SI level police stations to CI level Police Stations located at the municipal headquarters of the state. Now, to make all Police Stations in the state of CI level, I announce to upgrade the remaining 473 police stations of Sub-Inspector (SI) level to Inspector (CI) level.
 - II. In the last budget, for time-bound and effective investigation of criminal cases in the state, I had announced to increase the posts of Assistant Sub-Inspector to 10000 by upgradation of constable posts. I now propose to increase 2000 more posts of Assistant Sub Inspector

(ASI) by upgrading the constable posts.

- III. To increase presence of women in police stations, I announce to set up a Women ASI cadre and demarcate 1000 posts be for women ASI within these.
- IV. While presenting the budget on 23 February, 2022, it was announced that 10000 Home Guards would be taken in government offices for logistical work. Further, about 2000 additional Home Guard jawans will be deployed for law, traffic and other works in the coming year.
- V. For safe transport arrangement especially for women, a Command Control Centre will be set up with introduction of vehicle tracking devices and panic buttons in passenger vehicles (buses, taxis) and ambulances operating in the State.
- 75. To further strengthen the law and order of the state:
 - Police checkposts will be upgraded to Police Stations: Ranjitpura (Kolayat)-Bikaner, Kasarwadi (Kushalgarh)- Banswara and Baghpura (Jhadol)-Udaipur.
 - II. Police Stations will be opened in Papada (Sikrai), Baijupada-Dausa, Vivek Vihar (Luni)-Jodhpur and Ghatol-Banswara.
 - III. New police checkposts will be opened in Khumanpura (Mandal)-Bhilwara, Sathoor, Dugari (Hindoli)-Bundi, Bijauli (Bari)-Dholpur, Keshariabad (Dhariawad)- Pratapgarh and Panand (Vallabhnagar)-Udaipur.
- 76. There are about 25 Central/District Jails of the state situated in the midst of dense sttlements. Due to this, on the one hand it is unsuitable from the point of view of security, on the other hand, the prisoners do not get proper facilities due to lack of space. To transfer such prisons from densely populated areas to open places, it is proposed to prepare DPRs for all 25 jails. In addition, an alternative use of these places will be decided through DPR.
- 77. To provide easy and speedy justice to the common man:
 - I. Commercial Court will be opened in Bharatpur.
 - II. Camp Courts of Upper District and Sessions Court will be opened in Simalwada-Dungarpur and Jayal-Nagaur.

- III. Upper District and Session Court, Camp Kushalgarh-Banswara will be made permanent.
- IV. Civil Judge and Judicial Magistrate Court will be opened in Ahor-Jalore.

GOOD GOVERNANCE

- 78. We are making continuous efforts to ensure that services of various departments are available resident in every corner of the state. I believe that it is the right of common man to get proper medical and education facilities especially in remote areas of the state. Towards this, repair and maintenance will be ensured in all 3500-odd medical institutions and about 70000 government schools in the coming year. Along with this, maintainance of toilets in all medical institutions is also proposed through 'Sulabh Sanstha'. Rs.200 crore will be spent on these works.
- 79. For such families in which there are only disabled, widows and elderly members, I propose to start the "Mukhya Mantri-Hamari Zimmedari Yojana" so that they are not deprived of benefits of state welfare schemes. Under this Scheme, if such identified family just makes a call on Toll Free CM Helpline-181, then our 'Seva Prerak' (Service Facilitator) will visit their home to ensure various services inclusing addition of names for ration, caste & domicile certificate, and ensuring sanctioning of benefits of various schemes including pension and palanhaar yojana based on eligibility.
- 80. Additionally, to ensure that no family is deprived of state government schemes, special gram sabhas will be organised at each gram panchayat to disseminate these schemes and provide information effectively. Information about schemes will be given through street plays, material distribution and quiz, etc. through interactions with the villagers and beneficiaries.
- 81. Given the important role of journalists in creating awareness among people, for providing them adequate social security, I had made provision of pension and free medical treatment for the journalists. I now announce to start Pre-Matric and Post-Matric scholarships for their children from Rajasthan Patrakar and Literary Welfare Fund from the coming year.
- 82. Public utility works undertaken with participation of Donors/Trusts/ Societies/NGOs in different departments, in which the participation of such

organisation is 50% or more, for the implementation of works by such organisation, necessary provision will be made in the RTPP Rules, 2013.

- 83. Currently, the common man loses hard-earned money because of various economic offences such as land-grabbing, real estate, bank, insurance, deposit fraud, false bankruptcy, money laundering, formation of fake companies, etc. Lately incidents like Cooperative Credit Society scams have increased and the common man has had to suffer. I would like to appeal to people of the state not to become a victim of their racketeering. In order to provide speedy justice through prompt action to public, I announce the formation of a 'Directorate of Economic Offences' under the Finance Department.
- 84. Grant of unauthorised leases by housing societies continues to be a problem in Jaipur city. While on the one hand, this hinders planned development of the city, on the other there is always an apprehension for the common man to fall in a trap. To solve this problem, it is proposed to take effective action by making reasonable amendments in the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act, 2001.
- 85. For the convenience of common man, office of CBEO, CDPO and BCMHO will be opened at the newly created 57 *panchayat samiti* headquarters to strengthen education, health and women and child development services.
- 86. For expansion and strengthening of administrative units in the state:
 - I. DPR will be prepared for Mini Secretariat in Nawalgarh-Jhunjhunu.
 - II. Additional District Collector's office will be opened at Bali-Pali.
 - III. Sub-Divisional Offices will be opened at Mundwa-Nagaur, Nayagaon (Khairwara)-Udaipur, Mouzamabad-Jaipur and Senthal-Dausa.
 - IV. Office of Assistant Collector and Executive Magistrate (AC&EM) will be opened at Nathdwara-Rajsamand.
 - V. New Tehsil Sikar (Rural) will be formed by the reconstitution of Sikar and Dhod tehsils.
 - VI. Tehsil offices will be opened at Pal Deval-Dungarpur and Jhanwar (Luni)-Jodhpur.
 - VIII. Baroda Meo-Alwar and Ajitgarh-Sikar will be now Municipalities.
 - IX. Bhanokhar (Kathumar), Sahdoli-Alwar, Mandawar-Dausa and Sikri

(Nagar)-Bharatpur will be made Panchayat Samitis.

- X. Town Hall will be constructed at Nawan-Nagaur.
- XI. Office of Executive Engineer (Public Works Department) will be opened at Kathumar, Ramgarh-Alwar, Sujangarh-Churu, Sultanpur-Kota and Jayal-Nagore.
- XII. District Transport Office will be opened at Salumbar-Udaipur.
- 87. To eliminate the problem related to departmental promotion of state employees/officers:
 - While making the annual performance appraisal process online, auto forward / approval system will be adopted in case the comments are not marked by the competent authority in Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) within the stipulated time period.
 - II. If required, Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) meeting can be organised twice a year.
 - III. DPC will be arranged at the departmental level itself.
- 88. In view of the demand of the personnel engaged in various departments through Placement Agency (contract practice), I propose to make provision for imparting them 10/20/30 bonus marks as equivalent to the other contractual workers in regular recruitments.
- 89. Our government is sensitive towards elderly people, state pensioners and their families. At present, for cashless free medical facility under RGHS, only spouse and disabled sons and daughters are included in the pensioner's family. Keeping in view the demand of pensioners, I announce to provide medical facilities to dependent members of the pensioner's family as for the eligible family members of state government employees. There will be an expected annual financial burden of about Rs. 157 crore on this.
- 90. The problem of non-receipt of pension or pension related option has been brought to my notice by employees of various boards/corporations/ autonomous organisations of the State like RSMM, RTDC, Tilam Sangh, Power companies and various Universities. To resolve the issues related to pension in such Government organisations, it is proposed to take appropriate decision after evaluation.
- 91. For the employees in various state government departments, corporations,

boards, autonomous institutions, etc., on being completely disabled / unfit while on duty and taking voluntary retirement scheme (VRS), I announce to grant compassionate appointment to their dependents.

- 92. For payment of salaries and allowances of employees of urban local bodies of the State, it is proposed to provide one-time gap funding grant along with octroi reimbursement grant in the coming financial year, while adjusting the income of the local body. A provision of Rs.350 crore will be made for this.
- 93. From the coming year, it is proposed to bestow cash reward honour of Rs.2 lakh to Param Vishisht Seva Medal holder, Rs.1 lakh to Ati Vishisht Seva Medal holder, Rs.75 thousand to Vishisht Seva Medal holder, Rs.50 thousand to Sena Medal holder and Rs.25 thousand to Mention-in-Despatch holder.
- 94. While presenting the 2022-23 budget on the floor of honourable House on 23 February 2022, I had announced to implement the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) from the coming year (I April, 2022) for all employees appointed on or after I January, 2004, which has been welcomed nationwide by the employees as well as by public at large. I would like to draw attention of the honourable House towards NPS (National Pension Scheme) related problems of employees appointed on or after I January, 2004 and the rationale of implementing OPS as a solution of these problems:
 - As is known, the Old Pension Scheme was abolished in December, 2003 by the central government of NDA and NPS was implemented since I January, 2004.
 - II. Implementation of New Pension System created a sense of insecurity in the working class and their families about the future.
 - III. Currently, 5,22,962 personnel are under NPS. So far, 2,146 personnel are retired under NPS, and are receiving only a nominal amount of pension.
 - IV. Regarding NPS, in 2021 the National Human Rights Commission has also urged the Central Government to reconsider its provisions.
 - V. The CAG report number-13 of year 2020 has also raised questions regarding the effectiveness of the New Pension Scheme and the

guarantee of socio-economic security to the employees under this, in which the main points are:

- a) Even after 15 years from introduction of NPS, rules on service conditions/retirement benefits in respect of employees covered by NPS are still pending for finalization.
- b) There is neither any indication whether actuarial evaluation of the Scheme was conducted once in 2 years, nor has there been adoption of any other mechanism to assess the viability of the fund.
- c) Even after 15 years of the implementation of this scheme, no assurance has been given that the eligible employees are covered 100% under this scheme.
- VI. The New Pension Scheme has not been implemented for employees of Navy, Army and Air Force. It is clear from this that the Old Pension Scheme provides adequate social security to these personnel. Employees of BSF, CISF, CRPF, ITBP, SSB, etc. also extend similar services, they are also covered under NPS. Employees of Central and State Governments also discharge their duties with full commitment. Keeping two different types of pension schemes in such a situation is not only discriminatory but also against the principle of natural justice.
- VII. It is also worth noting that the Second National Judicial Pay Commission in its report submitted on 6 February, 2020 has also considered it inappropriate and recommended the implementation of OPS (Old Pension Scheme) for judicial employees.
- VIII. For an employee who dedicates about 35 years of life to government / public service, it is the responsibility of the government to provide full guarantee of financial security on retirement. It is also obvious that only on such a provision, the employee will be able to work for good governance with committment during the service period. Another important point is that on provision of OPS, increased inclination of talented youth towards government services will help maintaining quality of services.
- IX. It is said that Old Pension Scheme will increase financial burden on

governments and development and public welfare work will be affected. Here it is necessary to understand the fact that even when the Old Pension Scheme was applicable, there was excellent progress in every sector, and that no cutbacks have been proposed in development and public welfare because of re-implementation of Old Pension Scheme.

After the announcement made by me while presenting the Budget, it is natural for some of our colleagues to have doubts about the deduction from the employees to be made from I April, 2022. To eliminate this misconception, I now declare to abolish the monthly deduction of 10% from employees appointed on and after I January, 2004, from the salary payable on April I, 2022 (March paid in April). Also, I propose to refund the earlier deduction made from the employees in lump sum, of the remaining amount along with the interest rate payable on GPF at the time of their retirement, after adjusting the amount of Pensioner Medical Fund (RGHS Fund). With discontinuation of 10% deduction per month under NPS from April I, 2022, employees will get increased salary from April. This monthly salary increase will range from Rs.2300 to more than Rs.10000 depending on the seniority of the employee.

After the decision of bringing all our employees under OPS, I am happy that now Chhattisgarh has also announced its implementation and many other states are evaluating this. I have also requested the Hon'ble Prime Minister to implement Old Pension Scheme (OPS) so that the employees of Central and All India Services along with the employees of other states can also get the guarantee of financial security after retirement.
